शक्तिन् *çakalin*, i.e. *çakala+in*, m. A fish.

शकार *çakāra*, m. A silly brother-in-law of a king.

शकुन *çak+una* (or rather *çak+van+a*, cf. *çakunta*), I. m. A bird, Nal. 9, 12. II. n. An omen; a. auspicious, Lass. 43, 5; b. inauspicious, Paúch. 52, 11 (*kiñ çakunakāravāñ kiñ chit sañjātam*, Has something come to pass caused by a bird, or by an inauspicious omen, i.e. has there happened a misfortune?).—Comp. *A-*, n. an inauspicious omen, Çiç. 9, 83.

शकुनि *çak+uni* (see the last), I. m. 1. A bird, Paúch. iii. d. 140. 2. The Indian kite, Falco cheela. 3. A surname of the Aćvins, MBh. 1, 723. 4. A proper name, Indr. 3, 9. II. f. *nī*, A hen-sparrow.—Probably akin to O.N. *haukr*; Danish, hog; O.H.G. *habuh*; A.S. *hafoe*.

शकुन्त *çak+unta* (or rather *çak+vant+a*, cf. *çahuna*), m. 1. A bird, Paúch. i. d. 155. 2. The Indian vulture. 3. The blue jay.

शकुन्तक *çakunta+ka*, m., f. *tikā*, A bird, Utt. Rāmach. 29, 4.

शकुन्तला *çakunta+lā*, f. A proper name, Çāk. 3, 5.—Comp. *Abhijñāna-*, n. (suppl. *nāṭaka*, a drama), having as subject Çakuntalā, recognised by a token of remembrance, Çāk. 3, 12.

शकुनि *çakunti* (cf. *çakunta*), m. A bird, Utt. Rāmach. 69, 6.

शकुल *çakula*, m. A fish (cf. *çakalin*).

शक्त *çakrit*, and **सक्त** *sakrit* (for original *skrit*, from the old form of the vb. *kṛti*), n., the base of some cases is *çakan*, Fæces, excrement, Man. 2, 182.—Cf. σκώρ, σκατός, σκέρ-βολος; A.S. *seearn*; perhaps Lat. *stercus* and *cerda* in *su-cerda* (rather to *grīdh?*), etc.; and Goth. *spai-skuldrs*, Spittle.

शक्तर *çakkara*, and **शक्तर** *çakvara*, i.e. *çak+van+a* (with *r* for *n*), I. m. A bull. II. f. *rī*. 1. A zone, a girdle. 2. A woman of impure caste.

शक्ति *çak+ti*, f. 1. Strength, Paúch. i. d. 265; with loc., Bhartṛ. 2, 60 (*ātmadamane*, in restraining or ruling one's self). 2. Power, Hit. pr. d. 31, M.M. 3. The active power of a deity personified as his wife (as *Gauri* of *Civa*, etc.), Kathās. 3, 62 (of the god of love); eight particular goddesses, Brāhma, etc., cf. Wilson, Hind. Th. 2. ed. ii. 52, n. ad Mālat. 74, 5. 4. Signification, Bhāshāp. 79. 5. Allaying opposition. 6. An iron spear or dart, MBh. 5, 5259; a sword, Mālat. 82, 16.—Comp. *A-*, f. want of strength, Bhartṛ. 2, 44. *Ananta-, Amara-, Ugra-, Deva-, Bahu-*, m. proper names, Paúch. 3, 11, 12; 183, 20. *Ātmaçakti*, i.e. *ātman-*, f. one's own strength or power, Hit. pr. d. 31, M.M. *Yathā-*, adv. to the utmost of one's power, Hit. ii. d. 51; Lass. 59, 1. *Rati-*, f. the faculty of enjoying love, Böhltl. शक्तिस *çakti+tas*, adv. According to power or ability, Paúch. 161, 24.

शक्तिता *-çakti+tā*, in *bhojana-*, f. The faculty of enjoying food, Chāṇ. 40 in Berl. Monatsb. 1864, 409.
