Pa (CITD), abbreviation of the Telugu name of a certain measure of grain.

Pā (EI 32), contraction of the surname Pāṭhin.

pā (IE 8-1), abbreviation of pāda.

pabāsaņa (HA), the seat (āsana) on which the figure of a Jina is placed.

pacana (LL), a cooking place.

pada (EI 33), share; quarter of the standard land measure. (EI 4, 9; IA 17), a share.

(EI 21), a land-measure; cf. pada (pata) in Sel. Ins. p. 408.

Cf. sv-āngabhoga-pada (LP), 'under the head of personal expenditure'.

(LL; ML), foot-print.

 $p\bar{a}da$ (IE 8-6), same as Kannaḍa $h\bar{a}da$; 'one-fourth'; a measure equal to one-fourth of the standard land measure.

Cf. $po\bar{a}$ (EI 19), literally, 'one-fourth'; name of a land measure.

Cf. sa-pādika (LP), 'with one-fourth in addition'.

(Ep. Ind., Vol. XXXIII, p. 248), foot-print, foot-mark. padā, pādā (IE 8-4), corrupt forms of pātaka, 'part of a village'; often suffixed to the names of localities.

 $P\bar{a}da$ -bhakta (IE 8-2), 'devoted to the feet of'; cf. $P\bar{a}d$ - $\bar{a}nu$ -dhy $\bar{a}ta$ and $P\bar{a}d$ - $\bar{a}nud$ hy $\bar{a}na$ -rata.

Pādacārin (CII 3), 'moving on feet'; 'personified'.

padaga (SITI), Tamil; name of a measure of land; cf. pādaga.

 $p\bar{a}daga$ (IE 8-6), Tamil; same as Sanskrit $p\bar{a}taka$; a land measure which was equal to 240 kulis, and $6\frac{1}{4}$ of which made one veli.

pāda-ghaṭa (IE 8-8), meaning uncertain.

Padaikkāņvar (ASLV), a military class.

padaiparru (ASLV), a military station or cantonment. padakā (Chamba), same as paduka; foot-print.

padakāra (IE 8-8), probably, a shoe-maker or a hawker (Hindī pāukār).

padakka (ASLV), Tamil; a chest ornament.

pāda-kula (EI 12; IA 15), probably, 'a tribe of attendants',
