**Cveta**<sup>10</sup>, an island (= Cveta-dvipa). § 717b (Nārāyanīya): XII, 336, †12703 (*Kshirodadhṛ yottarato hi dvipah* Īh sa nāmnā, it is more than 32,000 yojanas distant from Meru, description of the inhabitants).—§ 717c (Uparicara): XII, 337, 12783 (*mahādvīpam*, had been visited by Ekata, Dvita, and Trita).—§ 717b (Nārāyanīya): XII, 338, 12859 (*dvīpam*); 339, 12861 (*mahādvīpam*, Nārada saw there Nārāyanā); 340, 12994 (*mahādvīpam*); 344, 13334 (do.). **Cvetabhadra**, a Yaksha. § 269 (Vaiçravaṇasabhāv.): II, 9, 397 (among the Yakshas in the palace of Kubera).

**Cvetācala**, a mountain (= Cveta<sup>4</sup>). § 564b (Çesha): V, 103, 3619 (°nibhākāraḥ, sc. Çesha). Cf. Cveta<sup>5</sup>, Cveta-parvata.

**Cvetācva** = Arjuna, q.v.

**Cvetadvipa**, an island (= Cveta<sup>10</sup>). § 717b (Nārāyanīya): XII, 336, †12709 (°vāsinām).—§ 717c (Uparicara): XII, 337, 12778 (*Kshirodadhṛ uttarataḥ*), 12781 (°vāsināḥ, description).—§ 717b (Nārāyanīya): XII, 344ββ, 13313, 13327, 13330, 13331, 13344, 13350, 13360 (Nārada had seen Nārāyanā on Ī.).—345, 13393. **Cvetaketu**<sup>1</sup>, a muni, son of Uddālaka. § 59 (Sarpasattra):

I, 53a, 2047 (among the sadasyas at the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya).—§ 187b (Pāndu): The muni Ī, son of Uddālaka, established the present usage among men that the sin of violating matrimonial chastity is regarded like to that of killing an embryo; this Ī established from anger, as one day, in the presence of his father, a brahman came and seized his mother by the hand and took her away; Uddālaka, however, excused the fact as it was the practice sanctioned by antiquity: I, 122, 4724, 4725, 4726, 4728, 4730, 4735 (*Uddalakasya putrona*).—§ 266 (Çakrasabhāv.): II, 7, 294 (in the palace of Indra).—§ 412 (Ashṭāvakra): III, 132, †10597

(*Auddālakiḥ*), †10598, †10599 (*Auddalakiḥ*), †10609, †10614, †10615, †10617 (Ī. was of the same age as Ashṭāvakra, the son of Uddālaka’s daughter, who regarded Ī. as his brother; Ī. informed Ashṭāvakra that Uddālaka was not his father, then they both repaired to the sacrifice of Janaka).—§ 635 (Rājadharma): XII, 34, 1229 (Uddālaka caused his son Ī. to be begotten by a disciple).—§ 640 (do.): XII, 57, 2056 (Uddālaka cast off Ī. because he deceived brahmans).—§ 775 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 166ζ, 7671 (*Auddālakiḥ*, among the rshis of the north)

**Cvetaketu**<sup>2</sup> = Cveta-kāti: I, 223, v. 69 (the çūra is wanting in C.).

**Cvetaki**, an ancient king. § 255 (Agniparābhava): I, 223 8098 (*Harihayopamah*), 8116, 8119, 8127, 8129, 813; (Cvetaki could not get any priests to assist him in his sacrifice; he then applied to Çiva, who caused Durvāsas to complete the sacrifice on the condition that Ī. poured libations of clarified butter into the fire for twelve years; from this Agni (fire) became sick; after the completion of the sacrifice Ī. ascended to heaven (only B.)). Cf. Cveta-ketu<sup>2</sup>.

**Cyāmā** = Draupadi: V, 3215, 4661.

**Cyāmāyā** äçrama(h), a tīrtha. § 733m (Citrakūṭa): XIII, 25, 1716.

**Cyāmāyana**, son of Viçvāmitra. § 721b (Viçvāmitrop.): XIII, 4β, 254.

**Cyena**, a rshi. § 266 (Çakrasabhāv.): II, 7, 293 (in the palace of Indra).

\***Cyena**, pl. (°āḥ) (“hawks”). § 126 (Amçāvat.): I, 66, 2621 (the offspring of Çyeni).

**Cyenacitra**, an ancient king. § 761 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 115δ, 5665 (among the kings who abstained from meat during the month of *Kārttika*).

**Cyenajit**<sup>1</sup>, son of Dala. § 451 (Vāmadevacar.): III, 192, †13202.

**Cyenajit**<sup>2</sup>, a prince. § 569 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 141γ, 4781 (has sided with the Pāndavas).
