[**Ghatotkacavadhaparvan (^{°va})**] (“the section including the slaughter of Ghatotkaca,” the 76th of the minor parvans of Mhbhr.; cf. Ghatotkacavadha). § 600: THE NIGHTLY COMBAT AFTER THE FOURTEENTH DAY: A dreadful battle took place between the Pāñcasas and the Kauravas. Duryodhana penetrated into the midst of the Pāñdava host, and caused an immense slaughter. Bhimasena, etc. (α) & Duryodhana; Yudhishtīra made Duryodhana insensible; Drona advanced to the rescue of Duryodhana; the Pāñdavas & Drona (VII, 153). Arjuna, etc. (β) & Drona. (Description of the awful night) (VII, 154.) Dhṛtarāshṭra asked Sañjaya about the battle (γ). Sañjaya related: Drona slew the Kaikeyas and the sons of Dhṛṣṭadyumna, etc., and Cibi; Duryodhana sent Drona a driver for his chariot; the Kaliṅga prince attacked Bhima (and Viçoka) and was slain by Bhima with his bare fists; Karna and Dhruva (the brother of the Kaliṅga prince) & Bhima, who slew Dhruva with his fist, and then Jayarāta with a slap of his palm; Çakuni rescued Karna; Dhṛtarāshṭra's sons & Bhima; Durmada mounted the chariot of Dushkarna; then, before the eyes of Karna, etc. (δ), Bhima, by a kick of his foot, caused that chariot to sink into the earth, and with his fists crushed Durmada and Dushkarna. All the kings fled away; Bhima repaired to Yudhishtīra; Nakula, etc. (ε) paid their adorations to Bhima. The Dhṛtarāshṭras + Drona & Bhima (VII, 155). Somadatta rebuked Sātyaki for having slain Bhūriçravas while sitting in prāya (ξ); Sātyaki's reply (η). Somadatta + Duryodhana and Çakuni & Sātyaki + Dhṛṣṭadyumna; Somadatta was carried away by his driver. Drona & Sātyaki + Yudhishtīra, etc. (θ); the Pāñdava host fled away; Arjuna + Bhima (+ Viçoka) + the Pāñcasas, etc. (ι) & Drona + Aqvatthāman. Ghatotkaca (description of his chariot) + Rā. & Aqvatthāman; description of the battle of Rā.; the sons of Dhṛtarāshṭra, etc., and Karna fled away, but not Aqvatthāman, who soon dispelled the illusive creations
