Kalāpa, a muni. § 264 (Sabhākriyāp.): II, 4a, 113 (in the palace of Yudhishtīra).

Kalāpagrāma, a city (?). § 793 (Mausalap.): XVI, 7, 251 (crossing Himavat the widows of Kṛṣṇa retired to *K.*).

Kalāparvata, a mountain. § 528 (Rāvaṇāgamanap.): III, 277, 15998 (starting from Laṅkā, Rāvaṇa crossed Trikūṭa and *K.*, and then came to the ocean).—§ 596 (Pratijñāp.): VII, 80, 2850 (crossed by Kṛṣṇa and Arjuna on their way to the abode of Çiva). Cf. Kālaçaila.

Kalāpatha, a son of Viçvāmītra. § 721 (Viçvāmītrop.): XIII, 4b, 249 (enumeration).

Kalāprshtha, a serpent. § 606 (Tripurākhyāna): VIII, 38, 1483 (among the serpents who became the *vālabandhanāḥ* of Çiva's horses).

Kalāpūjita = Çiva (1000 names²).

Kalāpushpaphalaprada(h) = Çiva (1000 names!) (B. *kalāḥ pu^o aḥ*).

Kālayavana, a prince. § 717b (Nārāyaṇīya): XII, 340, 12959 (*yaḥ K^oḥ khyāto Gārgyatejohhisambhṛtaḥ*, will be slain by Nārāyaṇa incarnate as Kṛṣṇa, cf. Harivaṃça, v. 6425 foll.).

Kālayogin = Çiva (1000 names²).

Kāleya, pl.
