

Laṅkāpraveṣṭa ("the entry into Laṅkā"). § 536 (cf. Rāmopākhyānap.). Rāvaṇa made Laṅkā yet more strong and armed his warriors. Rāma sent the monkey Āṅgada as messenger to Rāvaṇa. Āṅgada delivered the message of Rāma: "Release Sītā." Rāvaṇa became furious. Āṅgada leaped up with four Rākshasas and then let them fall; then he leaped over the walls of Laṅkā and informed Rāma. Rāma, Lakṣmaṇa, Vibhīṣhana, and Jāmbavat with monkeys and bears attacked Laṅkā and pulled down the fortifications. Then the host of the Rākshasas set out at the command of Rāvaṇa. A great battle ensued; at last Rāma withdrew his troops (III, 284).

Laṅkeçavānārī ("destroyer of the forests of the king of Laṅkā [i.e. Rāvaṇa]") = Hanūmat: IV, 1294 (^oketuh, i.e. Arjuna).

Lapetikā, a tirtha. § 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.): III, 85, 8157. **Lapitā**, the second wife of Mandapāla. § 259 (Cāringakop.): I, 229, 8347, 8348, 8350; 233, 8430, 8435, 8453.

Latā, an Apsaras. § 250 (Arjunavanavāsap.): I, 216, 7858 (among five Apsarases who according to the curse of a brahman became crocodiles, but were delivered by Arjuna).—§ 269 (Vaiçravanasabhāv.): II, 10, 394 (in the palace of Kubera).

Lāta, pl. (^oāh), a people. § 739 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 34c, 2158 (have been degraded from kshatriyas to cūdras).

Latāḥ = Īciva (1000 names¹).

Lauhitya¹ ("the bloody one"), name of an ocean. § 11 (Parvasaṅgr.): I, 2, 630 (*sāgarām*, cf. § 794).—§ 794 (Mahāprasthānikap.): XVII, 1, 33 (*salilārpaṇam*, Arjuna threw the Gāndīva [which belonged to Varuna] into L.). Cf. Lohita(h) udadhi(h).

Lauhitya², a river, the present Brahmaputra. § 268 (Varunasabhāv.): II, 9, 374 (*māhanadaḥ*, among the rivers present in the palace of Varuna).—§ 280 (Bhimasena): II, 30, 1100 (in the east; = the ocean, BR.).—§ 295 (Dyūtap.): II, 52, 1864 (*Lōam abhīta ca ye*; name of a mountain, Nil.). Cf. Lohita, Lauhitā.

Lauhitya³, a tirtha. § 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.): III, 85, 8144. — § 733⁴ (Punarāvartanandā): XIII, 25, 1732. Cf. Lauhitya².

Laumaharshaṇi = Ugraçravas, q.v.

Lavāḥ, pl. = Īciva (1000 names²).

Lavana¹, an Asura (according to Nil.). § 39 (Rāmaṇiyaka): I, 27, 1305 (had been seen on the island Rāmaṇiyaka).

Lavana², a Rākshasa. § 730^g (Upamanyu): XIII, 14c, 861 (^osya rakshasah, had been slain by Māndhāṭ with the cūla of Īciva).

Lavana³ = Īciva (1000 names²).

Lavāṇāçva, a r̄shi. § 324 (Dvaitavunapr.): III, 26a, 986 (waited upon Yudhishtīra).

***lavanajala** ("the sea of salt water") : I, 660, 1186 (*sāgarām*); cf. VI, 190, 406.

***lavanāmbhas** (do.): I, 619, 1131, 1168; III, 12787, 16239; XVII, 44.

Laya = Īciva (1000 names²).

Lekha, pl. (^oāh), a class of gods. § 730 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 18λλ, 1371 (only B., C. has *Lokāḥ*).

Lelihāna = Īciva: XIV, 198.

Likhita, an ancient r̄shi, brother of Čuṇka. § 266 (Cakrasabhāv.): II, 7, 292 (*Čuṇkaḥ ca Likhitaḥ ca*, in the palace of Indra).—§ 628 (Rājad.): XII, 23, 668, 670, 671, 678, 679, 686, 690, (693) (the story of L.'s being punished).—§ 746 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 56, 3320 (*Čuṇkaḥ*

ca *Lōas tathā*, ascended to heaven by making gifts of sesame seed).—§ 767 (do.): XIII, 137a, 6263 (king Sudyumna attained to blessed regions by having caused L. to be punished, cf. § 628). Cf. Brahmarshi.

Lilādhya, a son of Viçvāmitra. § 721b (Viçvāmitrop.): XIII, 4β, 252.

Lilāyudha, v. Nilāyudha.

***linga**, the Phallus of Īciva. VII, 9485, 9486, 9489, 9616, 9617, 9625, 9631; X, 780, 782; XIII, 824 (?), 1255 (Īciva's 1000 names²), 7512, 7516, 7517, 7518.

Lingādhya = Īciva (1000 names²).

Lobha = Īciva (1000 names¹).

Loha, pl. (^oāh), a people. § 279 (Arjuna): II, 27, 1033 (in the north, vanquished by Arjuna on his digvijaya).

Lohajāṅga, pl. (^oāh), a people. § 294 (Dyūtap.): II, 50, 1804 (living in the palace of Yudhishtīra as bondsmen).

Lohājavaktra, a warrior of Skanda. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 45η, 2577.

Lohamekhalā, a matr. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 46θ, 2636, 2639 (also B.).

Lohatārīnī, a river. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 326 (so C., B. has *Lohi[a]tāraṇī*).

Lohita¹, a serpent. § 268 (Varunasabhāv.): II, 9, 360 (in the palace of Varupa).

Lohita² (a country, BR.; a king, PCR.). § 279 (Arjuna): II, 27, 1025 (in the north, conquered by Arjuna on his digvijaya).

Lohita³, a river (= Brahmaputra?). § 775 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 186a, 7647 (*māhanadāḥ*). Cf. Lauhitya, Lohityā.

Lohita(h) udadhi(h) ("the bloody ocean"). § 498 (Skandotpatti): III, 226, 14366 (*lohitasyodadheḥ kanya*, nursed Skanda).—§ 502 (Manushyagrahak.): III, 230, 14494 (do., named Lohitāyani and worshipped on kadamba trees). Cf. III, 14269 (*lohitodo Varuṇalayah*), 14524 (*lohitode*).

Lohitāksha¹, name of a sūta. § 62 (Sarpasattra): I, 56, 72119 (*Paurāṇikīḥ*).—§ 68 (Āstika): I, 58, 2177 (*sūtāya etapataye*, had announced that a brahman, viz. Āstika, would interrupt the sacrifice, cf. I, 2029). Cf. Sūta.

Lohitāksha², a companion of Skanda. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 45, 2526 (given to Skanda by Brahmā).

Lohitāksha³ = Īciva (1000 names²).—Do.⁴ = Vishṇu (1000 names).

Lohitākshī, a mātr. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 46θ, 2640, 2642.

Lohitāṅga¹ ("the red-limbed," i.e. the planet Mars [*Āṅgarakā*]). § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 3, 86 (*Brahmaruci samāvṛtya Lōo vyavasthitāḥ*, omens).—§ 600 (Ghatotkacavādhap.): VII, 166, 7408 (? *nipapāta Lōa ivakaçād diptaraçmir yadrochaya*, = the Sun, PCR.).

Lohitāṅga² = Sūrya (the sun): VII, 8877; IX, 3113 (? ^oāv ivā).

Lohitāntargatā drṣṭih = Īciva (1000 names¹).

Lohitārāni, v. Lohatārīnī.

Lohitāyani ("daughter of the bloody [ocean]"). § 502 (Manushyagrahak.): III, 230, 14494 (*Lohitasyodadheḥ kanya dhātri Skandasya sā smṛtā | Lōir ity evaṃ kadame sā hi pūjyate*).

Lohityā, a river. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 343 (in Bhāratavarsha). Cf. Lohita, Lauhitā.

Loka = Īciva (1000 names²).

Loka, pl. (^oāh), a class of gods. § 730 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 18λλ, 1371 (only B., C. has *Lokāḥ*).
