**Lokapālasabhākhyāna(m)** ("description of the palaces of the Lokapālas"). § 11 (Parvasaṅg.): I, 2, 408 (i.e. Lokapālasabhākhyānaparvan).

[**Lokapālasabhākhyānaparvan**] ("the section containing the description of the palaces of the Lokapālas," the 21st of the minor parvas of the Mahābhārata). (Cf. Lokapālasabhākhyāna.)—§ 265: While the Paṇḍavas were sitting in that palace, with the great Gandharvas, there came unto them the devarshi Nārada (his accomplishments are enumerated at great length), having wandered over the different worlds, accompanied by the ṛṣhis Pārijāta, Kaiṣata, Sumukta, and Saumya. Nārada informed Yudhishtira about religion, pleasure, and profit, in the form of questions about his conduct. By following his advice Yudhishtira conquered the whole earth (II, 5). Yudhishtira answered that he observed all those rules. Then he asked Nārada if he had ever seen a palace like his. Nārada (Brahmarṣhiḥ, v. 281) replied that no palace among men was like his, but that he would describe unto him the palaces of Pitṛāja (i.e. Yama), Varuṇa, Indra, the dweller on Kailāsa (i.e. Kubera), and Brahmān, always worshipped by gods, Pitṛs and Sādhyas, etc. (II, 6).—§ 266: Çakrasabhāvarṇana (q.v.).—§ 267: Yamasabhāvarṇana (q.v.).—§ 268: Varuṇasabhāvarṇana (q.v.).—§ 269: Vaiçvānasabhāvarṇana (q.v.).—§ 270: Brahma-sabhāvarṇana (q.v.).—§ 271: Yudhishtira said: It appears that almost all the monarchs are in the sabhā of Yama—the Nāgas, Daityas, rivers, and oceans in that of Varuṇa—the Yakṣas, Guhyakas, Rākṣasas, Gandharvas, Aparasas, and Īiva in that of Kubera—the great ṛṣhis, and gods, and çāstras in that of Pitāmaha (i.e. Brahmān); and in that of Çakra (i.e. Indra) gods, Gandharvas and various ṛṣhis, but only one king, the rājareṣi Hariçoandra (b); this is explained by Nārada. Paṇḍu, beholding the good fortune of Hariçoandra, had asked Nārada to tell Yudhishtira to subjugate the whole earth and then perform a rājasūya. Thereby also Paṇḍu and his ancestors would go to the region of Indra. Brahmaraṣhasas, that destroy the sacrifices, always look for opportunities of obstructing it. Then Nārada went away to the city of the Dāçārṣas, accompanied by the ṛṣhis with whom he had come (II, 12).
