

Sannateyu, son of Raudrācva. § 150 (Pūruvamp.) : I, 94, 3701 (tenth son of Raudrācva).

Sannihata, name of a fire. § 493 (Āngirasa) : III, 221, 14195.

Sannihati or **Sannihityā**, name of a tīrtha. § 368 (Tīrthayātrāp.) : III, 83, 7061, 7062, 7065, 7066.

Sannivāsa = Vishnu (1000 names).

Sannyastapāda, pl. (°āḥ), a people. § 273 (Rājasūyārambhap.) : II, 14, 592 (so B., C. has *Sanya*°, fled from fear of Jarāsandha).

Santa, a brahman. § 736b (Vitahavyop.) : XIII, 30, 2001 (son of Satya and father of Cravas).

Santāna, name of a weapon. § 568 (Bhagavadyānap.) : V, 96φ, 3491 (will be employed by Arjuna).

santānaka, adj. ("like to the Santāna tree of Indra's heaven") : III, 14536 (°vanaiḥ); V, 3833 (*nagaḥ*), XIII, 3825 (°vanaiḥ).

Santānikā, a mātṛ. § 615u (Skanda) : IX, 46φ, 2627.

Santāpīṭṛ = Āśiva (1000 names¹).

Santarjana, a warrior of Skanda. § 615u (Skanda) : IX, 45γ, 2620.

Sanyastapāda, pl. v. Sannyastapāda.

Saphalodaya = Āśiva (1000 names²).

Saptacaru, a tīrtha (= Vaḍavā). § 359 (Vaḍavā) : III, 82, 5040 (origin of the name).

Saptadaça = Kṛṣṇa : XII, 1642 (*yam prahuḥ s°am Sāṅkhyāḥ*).

Saptaganga, a tīrtha. § 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.) : III, 84, 8007.—§ 733g (Ānuçāsanik.) : By giving oblations of water to one's pitṛs at S. and *Trigāṅga* and *Indramārga* one obtains *amṛta*, etc. : XIII, 25, 1703.

Saptagodāvara, a tīrtha. § 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.) : III, 85, 8186.

Saptaidhas, **Saptajihva** = Vishnu (1000 names).

Saptakṛt, a Viçvadeva. § 749 (Ānuçāsanik.) : XIII, 91γ, 4361 (enumeration).

Saptamahābhāga = Mahāpurusha (Mahāpurushastava).

Saptapāla, a muni. § 264 (Sabbhākriyāp.) : II, 4a, 109 (only B., C. has *Satyapālah*).

Saptarāva, a Suparna, son of Garuḍa. § 564 (Mātallyop.) : V, 101β, 3596 (so B., C. has *Saptavārah*).

Saptārcis = Agni, q.v. (add. XVII, 36).

Saptarshi, pl. (°ayāḥ) ("the seven rshis," also name of a constellation (Ursa major), sometimes confounded with the seven mindborn sons of Brahmā) : [§ 191 (Arjuna) : I, 123a, 4807 (*sapta . . . maharshayāḥ*, i.e. Bharadvāja, Kaçyapa, Gautama, Viçvāmitra, Jamadagni, Vasishṭha, and Atri)].—§ 259b (Arundhati) : I, 233, 8457 (°madhyagām, i.e. Vasishṭha).—§ 266 (Cakrasabhbāv.) : II, 7, 309 (in the palace of Indra).—§ 296 (Dyūtap.) : II, 53, 1919 (*Mahendram iva Devendram divi S°ayo yathā*, sc. *abhiṣagmukh*).—§ 323 (Dvaitavanapr.) : III, 25, 1958 (*divi prabhānti*).—§ 412 (Ashtāvakriyā) : III, 134, 10664 (*sapta*).—[§ 439 (Yakshayuddhap.) : III, 163, 11855 (*sapta devarshayāḥ . . . Vasishṭha's] āsthayā, sc. Dharma).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.) : VI, 3, 94 (°*īndām . . . prabhā*, omens); 6, 215 (repair to Meru on every *parvan*).—§ 595 (Shoḍaśarāj., v. Saptarshi', sg. ("one of the seven rshis"). § 730 (Ānuçāsanik.) : XIII, 18λλ, 1339 (in the manvantara of Manu Sāvarṇa, Kṛṣṇa [i.e. Vyāsa] will become one of the S.).

Saptarshikunda, pl. (°āni), a tīrtha. § 364 (Tīrthayātrāp.) : III, 83, 6042.

Saptasapti = Sūrya (the Sun) : III, 193; VIII, 473.

Saptasārasvata, a tīrtha on the Sarasvatī. § 365 (Māñkanaka) : III, 85, 6085 (there Māñkanaka won ascetic success), 7003.—§ 615 (Baladevatīrthayātrā) : IX, 37, 2184 (*tīrtham*, visited by Balarāma); 38, 2186 (*tīrtham*).—§ 615 (do.) : The seven Sarasvatīs cover this universe. Whithersoever the Sarasvatī was summoned, thither she made her appearance. Her seven forms are *Suprabhā*, etc. (a). I) *Pitāmaha* [i.e. Brahmā] was once performing a sacrifice at Pushkara; whatever he thought of, immediately appeared, the *Gandharvas* sung, the *Apearases* danced. The rshis missed Sarasvatī, Brahmā thought of her and she appeared there at Pushkara under the name of *Suprabhā*. II) At Naimisha many munis were assembled, performing sacrifices and talking about the *Vedas*, they thought of Sarasvatī, who made her appearance and came to be called *Kāñcanakēti*. III) Similarly she came to the sacrifice of *Gaya* in the country of the *Gayas* (*Gayeshu*), where she flowed from the slopes of
