Tālacara, pl. (āk), a people. § 569 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 140β, 4451. Cf. Tālajaṅgha pl.

Tāladhvaja¹ ("whose banner shows the palmyra palm") = Bhishma, q.v.—Do.² (do.) = Balarāma: IX, 1948 (*Rāmāh*), 2139, 3044.

Tālajaṅgha ("the king of the Tālajaṅghas?"). § 547 (Karṇa): III, 303, 17014 (had been destroyed by the curse of a brahman (*brahmādanḍena*)).—§ 736b (Vitahavyop.): XIII, 30, 1946 (Haihaya and T. were the sons of Vatsa).—§ 772g (Aurva): XIII, 154, 7223 (*oṣṇ mahākshatram Aurvenaikena nāśitam*).

Tālajaṅgha, pl. (āk), a people. § 387 (Sagara): III, 106, 8832 (the Haihayas and the T. were vanquished by Sagara).—§ 562 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 74γ, 2729 (*Bahulas T^oānām*).—§ 739 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 34γ, 2126 (vanquished by the Bhṛgus, cf. XIII, 7223).

Tālākata, name of a city (?). § 284 (Sahadeva): II, 31, 1169 (in the south, conquered by Sahadeva).

Tālaketu¹, a prince. § 317b (Kṛṣṇa Vāsudeva): III, 12, 492 (had been slain by Kṛṣṇa).

Tālaketu² ("whose banner shows the palmyra palm") = Balarāma: IX, †2357.—Do.³ = Bhishma: V, 5081; VI, 1816.

Tālavana, pl. (āk), a people. § 284 (Sahadeva): II, 31, 1175 (in the south, vanquished by Sahadeva).

Tālin = Civa (1000 names¹).

Tamas¹, a brahman. § 736b (Vitahavyop.): XIII, 30, 2002 (son of Āravas and father of Prakāṇa).

Tamas² = Civa (1000 names¹).

Tamasā, a river. § 494 (Āngirasa): III, 222, 14231 (among the rivers who are mothers of fires).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 338.

Tamasī, a river. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 339 (only C., B. has Mānavī).

*Tamoḡhna ("destroying darkness") = Sūrya (the Sun): III, 193; VII, 6296.

Tamontakṛt, a warrior of Skanda. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 45γ, 2560.

*Tamonuda ("dispersing darkness") = Sūrya (the Sun): III, 152, 11892, 17099; VI, 5765.

Tāmrā¹, wife of Kaçyapa (?). § 126 (Ampāvāt.): I, 166, 2620 (mother of five daughters: Kāki, Čyeni, Bhāsi, Dhṛtrāśhtri, and Čuki).

Tāmrā², a river. § 459 (Mārkanḍeyas.): III, 188a, 12909 (seen in the body of Nārāyaṇa).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 335.

Tāmracūḍa, a companion of Skanda. § 61ou (Skanda): IX, 46, 2669 (given to Skanda by Arūṇa; "a cock" PCR.).

Tāmracūḍa, a māṭṛ. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 46θ, 2636.

Tāmrāhvaya, name of a dvīpa. § 284 (Sahadeva): II, 31, 1172 (*dvīpam*, in the south, conquered by Sahadeva).

Tāmrālipta ("the king of the Tāmrāliptas"). § 232 (Svayamvarap.): I, 186, 6993 (present at the svayamvara of Draupadi).—§ 280 (Bhimasena): II, 30, 1098 (*rājānam*, in the east, conquered by Bhimasena).

Tāmrālipta, pl. (āk), a people. § 295 (Dyūtap.): II, 52, 1874 (brought tribute to Yudhiṣṭhīra). Cf. next.

Tāmrāliptaka, pl. (āk), a people (= the prec.). § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9μ, 364.—§ 595 (Shoḍacarāj., v. Rāma Jāmadagnya): VII, 70β, 2436 (slain by Rāma Jāmadagnya).
