Urjayoni, a son of Viçvāmitra. § 721b (Viçvāmitrop.): XIII, 4_β, 258 (*Urjāja° C.*).

Urjita, **Urjitaçāsana** = Vishnu (1000 names).

Urmilā, wife of Yama (probably wrong reading instead of Dhūmorā, q.v.): § 565 (*Gālavacar*.): V, 117, 3968 (reme . . . īçayām yathā Yamāh, B. yathā Dhūmorāyā Yamāh).

Urñanābha, a son of Dhṛtarāshṭra. § 130 (Āmpçāvat.): I, 67, 2731 (enumeration).—§ 182 (Dhṛtarāshṭraputraprānāmāk.): I, 117, 4544 (do.).

Urñayu(s), a Gandharva. § 191 (*Arjuna*): I, 123, 4811 (among the Devagandharvas present at the birth of Arjuna).—§ 565 (*Gālavacarita*): V, 117, 3975 (reme . . . Menakāyām yathā°h).

Urukrama ("making wide strides") = Vishnu (Kṛshna): III, 12984 (*Hṛshikeçah*, i.e. Nārāyaṇa): XII, 1506 (= Kṛshna).

Urva, a ṛshi. § 745c (Cyavana-Kuçikasamv.): XIII, 56, 2907 (father of Rēka, cast the fire of his anger into the mouth of the mare's head (*vađavāvaktra*)). Cf. Aurva.

Urvaci¹, an Apsaras, wife of Purūravas. § 52 (*Janamejaya*): I, 44, †1811 (yathā°im prāpya purd Purūrādh.).—§ 135
