

Varāhācva, v. *Vai*.

Varāhadhvaja ("having a boar in his banner") = Jayadratha: VII, 6208 (cf. VI, 4134).

Varāhaka, a serpent. § 67 (Sarpasattra): I, 57, 2159 (of Dhṛtarāshṭra's race).

Varāhakarna, a Yaksha. § 269 (Vaiçravaṇasabhāv.): II, 9, 398 (in the palace of Kubera).

Varāhaparvata (*Va^o*, B.), a mountain. § 717b (Nārāyaṇiya): XII, 346, 18422.

Varāhvavatāra(h) ("Vishnu's incarnation as a boar"). § 422 bis (Gandhamādanapr.). Asked by Yudhiṣṭhīra Lomaça related: In the *Kṛta-yuga*, when the primeval deity (Ādidevah puruṣanah) assumed the function of *Yama*, the creatures did not die, and multiplied to such a degree that the Earth sank 100 *yojanas*. She applied to Nārāyaṇa (= Vishnu), who, in the shape of a boar with a single tusk (ekagrīga), lifted her up by means of that. The gods, with the *rishis*, became afraid of the agitation produced, but learnt the matter from Brahmā, and with him they went to Nandana, there Vishnu was sitting in the shape of a boar with *Criwatea* on his breast, together with *Suparṇa*, and having seen him they returned home (III, 142).

Vāvana, name of a country (?). § 555 (Sainyodyogap.): V, 19, 600 (among the regions which were overrun by the army of the Kurus).

Vāranāhvaya ("named after the elephant"), adj. (sc. *nagara*) or subst. = Hāstinapura: III, 15083; V, 6002; XV, 1098 (*nagarām*).

Vāranasāhvaya (do.), adj. (sc. *pura*) or subst. = Hāstina-pura: I, 4966 (*purām*); III, 11326, 17168; IX, 3148; XIII, 7705 (*purām*); XIV, 1501, 1936 (*purām*), 2057 (do.), 2435.

Varānasi, a river. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 338 (om. y B., C. has *Varuṇḍm Asīm*).

Vārānasi, a city in the country of the Kācīs, the present Benares. § 167 (Vicitravīryoparama): I, 102, 4084 (the residence of the father of Āmbā, etc.).—§ 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.): III, 84, 8056 (a tīrtha).—§ 561c (Kṛṣṇa Vāsudeva): V, 48, 1883 (*nāgarī*, burnt by Kṛṣṇa).—§ 561 (Yānasandhip.): V, 50, 2007 (*Kācīpati rājā V^o yām*).—§ 589g (Dhṛṣṭadyumna): VII, 10, 364 (at *V.* Dhṛṣṭadyumna had vanquished the son of the Kācī king).—§ 630 (Rājadh.): XII, 27, 807 (at *V.* Bhīṣma had challenged all the kings, all. to § 167).—§ 680b (Tulādhāra-Jājalisamv.): XII, 262, 9284, 9287, 9319, 9321 (the abode of Tulādhāra).—§ 730 (Ānuśāsanik.): XIII, 14ξ, 694 (Indra worshipped Civa in *V.*); 18^{xx}, 1333 (in *V.* Civa made grants to Jaigishavya).—§ 736b (Vitahavyop.): XIII, 30, 1955 (built by Divodāsa).—§ 763b (Maitreyabhikshā): XIII, 120, 5795.—§ 778b (Samvartta-Maruttiya): XIV, 6, 141 (the abode of Civa), 146 (*purīm*). Vārāṅga = Vishnu (1000 names).
Vārāṅgi, a princess, daughter of Dhṛadvat and wife of Samyāti. § 156 (Pūrvavāp.): I, 95, 13767 (Dhṛadvat dūhitārām).

Vārapācīyāpavāha(P), pl. (°dā), names of peoples. § 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9μ, 352 (so C., B. has *Vāravāsyāyāvāha^o*).

Varaprada = Mahāpurusha (Mahāpurushastava^v).

Varāroha = Vishnu (1000 names).

Varātivaradā = Civa (1000 names¹).

Vāravāsyāyavāha, pl., v. Vārapācīyāpavāha.

Varavarnīni = Durgā (Umā): VI, 797.

Vāravatyā, a river. § 268 (Varunasabhāv.): II, 9, 374 (present in the palace of Varuna).

Varayu, a king. § 562 (Bhagavadyānap.): V, 74γ, 2731 (Mukhuyāśām, among the wicked kings who annihilated their kinsmen and relatives).

Varcas¹, son of Soma. § 116 (vasu, pl.): I, 66, 2586 (Somasya sutaḥ, with Manoharā, father of Ciçira, Prāṇa, and Rāmaṇa [or of Varcasvin (?) q.v.].—§ 130g (Abhimanyu): I, 67, 2747 (Somaputraḥ, incarnate as Abhimanyu), 2750.—§ 795 (Svargārohanap.): XVIII, 5μ, 165 (Somaputraḥ . . . so 'bhīmanyuḥ). Cf. Somuputra.

Varcas² = Suvarcas: III, 14164.

Varcas³, son of Sucetas. § 736b (Vitahavyop.): XIII, 30, 2000 (son of Sucetas and father of Vitahavya).

Varcasvin¹, son of Varcas¹(?). § 116 (Vasu, pl.): I, 66, 2586. (PCR. takes varcasvin as adj. ("resplendent") and attributive of Varcas; according to BR. *V^o* is the name of the son of Varcas (cf. Hariv. v. 155 and 12483), and as such father of Ciçira, etc.; see Varcas¹).—Do.² = Civa (1000 names¹).

Vārddhaksnatri = Jayadratha, q.

Vārddhakshemi, a Vṛṣṇi prince. § 232 (Svayamvarap.): I, 186, 6989 (came to the svayamvara of Draupadi).—§ 572 (Rathātirathasaikhyānap.): V, 171, 5909 (a mahāratha in the army of Yudhiṣṭhīra).—§ 589 (Dronābhishhekāp.): VII, 10, 360 (only B.; = Anādhṛṣṭi).—§ 592 (Sūṃçaptakavādhāp.): VII, 21μ, 916; 23ο, 985 (proceeded against Drona, description of his horses); 25, 1114 (*Vārshneyam*, fought with Kṛpa).—§ 604 (Karṇap.): VIII, 6, 178 (had been slain). Cf. Vārshneya.

Vārdhamānadvāra, name of a gate in Hāstina-pura. § 787 (Ācramavāsāp.): XV, 18, 443.
