**Vedānta**, mostly pl. (<sup>o</sup>dh), a kind of literary works, probably identical with the Upanishads: IV, 1593 (known by Drona); VI, 1397 (<sup>o</sup>kṛt, sc. Kṛṣṇa); XII, 1943 (<sup>c</sup>ādīgataḥ, sc. dharmāḥ), 7157 (sg.), 8723, 8971 (<sup>c</sup>eṣu ca gīyate), 10573, 11167 (<sup>o</sup>gamanadōipam), 11750 (<sup>o</sup>jñānakovidāḥ); XIII, 1080 (sg.), 3449 (<sup>o</sup>nīṣṭhasya); XIV, 345 (devair (B. **Vegavat<sup>2</sup>**, one or more Asuras. § 92 (Ampāvat.): I, 65, 2532 (among the sons of Danu).—§ 130 (do.): I, 67, 2646 (incarnate as one of the Kaikeya princes).—§ 320 (Saubhāvadhop.): III, 16, 675 (*Daiteyāḥ*), 676, 678 (follower of Ālava; slain by Āmba).

**Vegavat<sup>3</sup>**, a Rākshasa. § 585 (Bhīshmavadhap.): VI, 91v, 4083 (slain by Duryodhana).

**Vena**, one or more ancient princes. § 6 (Anukram.): I, 1a, 227 (in Sañjaya's enumeration).—§ 139 (Manu Vaivasvata): I, 75, 3140 (son of Manu Vaivasvata).—§ 267 (Yamasabhāv.): II, 8, 326 (in the palace of Yama).—§ 641 (Rājadh.): XII, 58, 2214 (son of Atibala and Sunithā, the daughter of Mṛtyu; d: V. was a slave of wrath and malice; the rshis slew him with kuḍa blades purified with mantras, then they bored his right thigh, thereupon came out a short-limbed person, resembling a charred brand with black-red eyes and black hair, to whom they said *nishida* (“sit down”); from him have sprung the *Nishādas* (e) and other *Mlecchas*, living in the *Vindhya* mountains. The maharshis then bored the right hand of V., thence sprang a person who was a second Indra in form, etc., and acquainted with the *Vedas*, etc. (i.e. *Pr̄thu* (f)).

**Venin**, a serpent. § 66 (Sarpasattra): I, 57, 2154 (of Kauravya's race).

**Venudārisuta** (“the son of Venudāri”), a prince. § 515 (Karnadigvijaya): III, 254, 15251 (vanquished by Karpa on his digvijaya).

**Venupa**, pl. (<sup>o</sup>dh), a people. § 569 (Bhīgavadyānap.): V, 140β, 4751 (only B., C. has *Renupāḥ*).

**Venuvinādhārā**, a māṭṛ. § 61u (Skanda): IX, 46θ, 2639.

**Vetalajanani**, a māṭṛ. § 615u (Skanda): IX, 46θ, 2631.

**Vetasaka** (*C<sup>o</sup>*, C.), pl., name of a place. § 594 (Mṛtyu): VII, 54, 2095 (there Mṛtyu performed austerities).

**Vetasikā**, a tīrtha. § 370 (Tīrthayātrāp.): III, 84, 8034 (<sup>o</sup>m galvā Pitāmahānīśvitarām / aṣvamedham arāpnoti gacchod Auçanasiṁ galvām).

**Vetrakiyagra**, name of the residence of a certain king. § 215 (Bukavadhap.): I, 160, 6213 (the Rākshasa Baka lived in the territory of V.).

**Vetrakiyavana** (B. *Vaitra*<sup>o</sup>), name of a forest. § 316 (Kirmīrāvadhap.): III, 11, 415 (there the Rākshasa Baka had been slain). Cf. prec.

**Vetravatī**, a river. § 459 (Märkanḍeyas.): III, 188a, 12907 (seen in the stomach of Nārāyaṇa).—§ 494 (Āngirasa): III, 222, 14231 (among the rivers who are mothers of fires).—§ 574 (Jambūkh.): VI, 9λ, 323, 327 (only B., C. has *Candrabbhāgā*).—§ 775 (Ānuçāsanik.): XIII, 166a, 7647.

**Vetrika**, pl. (<sup>o</sup>dh), a people. § 578 (Bhīshmavadhap.): VI, 51v, 2097 (only B., C. has *Venikāḥ*).

**Vibhāga**, **Vibhāgajīva** = Čiva (1000 names<sup>2</sup>).

**Vibhakta** = Skanda: III, 14633.

**Vibhānda**, a rṣi. § 637 (Rājadh.): XII, 47v, 1598 (among the rshis who surrounded Bhīshma).

**Vibhāndaka**, a rṣi, father of Rāhyācīṅga. § 391 (Rāhyācīṅga): III, 110, 9999 (*viprashīḥ*); 111, †10047 (*Kācyapāḥ*, b: the body of Vibhāndaka was covered with hair down to the tip of the nails), †10048; 113, (†10070), †10074, †10079 (<sup>o</sup>syātmajan, i.e. Rāhyācīṅga), †10081, †10089. Cf. Kācyapa.

**Vibhāvasu**<sup>1</sup>, a rṣi, brother of Supratika. § 41 (Supratika): I, 29, 1354 (*maharshiḥ*), 1356, 1361, 1362 (*Supratika-V<sup>o</sup>s*) (cursed by Supratika, V. became a tortoise, who was afterwards devoured by Garuḍa).

**Vibhāvasu**<sup>2</sup>, a rṣi. § 324 (Dvaitavānap.): III, 26a, 987 (worshipped Yudhishṭhīra).
