çūdrā, *n.* a man of the fourth caste, a Çūdra.

çūna, *n.* emptiness. [√çū, 1177a.]

çūra, *a.* mighty, bold; *as m.* man of might, hero. [√çū, 1188c: çūra is parallel w. *ku-po-s, 'mighty,' whence τὸ κῦρ-ος, 'might' (cf. ἀλσx-ρῶ-s w. τὸ ἀλσx-ος).]

çūrpa, *n.* a plaited basket for winnowing grain.

√ 1çr (çrñāti; çagré; áçarīt; çariṣyāti, -te; çirná [957b]; -çiryā; çiryáte). crush; break; tear. [cf. Eng. *har-m*, which answers to a Skt. *çar-ma.]

+ vi, *pass.* be broken to pieces; perish, 60⁹.

+ sam, break (a bow); *like* zusammenbrechen.

√ 2çr, *see* çrā, 'boil.'

çrñga, *n.* horn.

çrñgin, *a.* horned; *as m.* horned beast.

çrtá, *see* √çrā.

çéva, *a.* kind; dear. [cf. çivá.]

çeṣa, — 1. *m. n.* rest, remainder, 68¹⁷; çeṣe, *like* Ger. *im Uebrigen*, for the rest, 12¹⁰; — 2. *a.* remaining, 55¹⁵. [√1çis, 'leave.']

çeṣas, *n.* offspring. ['those whom one leaves behind him, one's relicts,' √1çis, 'leave.']

çóka, *m.* pain, grief. [√çuc, 216. 1.]

çoka-ja, *a.* grief-born; çokajam vāri, grief-born water, *i.e.* tears, 10¹⁹.

çokārta, *a.* sorrow-stricken. [ārta.]

çocis-keça, *a.* having flame-locks, with locks of flame. [çocis, 187: 1297, cf. 1280b.]

çócistha, *a.* most or bright flaming. [√çuc, 468.]

çocis, *n.* flame; beam; heat. [√çuc, 1153.]

çóna, — 1. *a.* red, deep-red; — 2. *m.* Sone or Red River, affluent of the Ganges. [prop. 'flame-colored'. cf. ἔ-καυ-σα, 'burned,' καῦ-μα, 'heat.']

çonita, *n.* blood; *also pl.* [çóna, 1176d.]

çobhaná, *a.* beautiful. [√2çubh, 'adorn,' 1150. 2a.]

çóbhiṣṭha, *a.* most swiftly moving onward or most beautiful, 78⁵, *according as the word is referred to* √1çubh *or to* √2çubh — *see these.* [468.]

√ çeand (*intens. ppl.* cāniçadat [1002c]). shine, glance. [for *skandh: cf. ξανθ-ός, 'gold-yellow'; καθαρός, Doric κοθ-αρός, 'clear, clean, pure'; κἀνθ-αρος, 'coal'; Lat. *cand-ēre*, 'glow.']

çeandrā, *a.* shining. [√çeand, 1188a: cf. viçvā-çandra, and candrā.]

√ çcut (çeótati; çuceóta; áçuçutat; çcutitá). drip.

çcut, *vbl.* dripping. [√çcut.]

çmaçānā, *n.* the place for burning the corpses and for burying the bones, cemetery.

çmáçru, *n.* beard.

√ çyā or çī (çyāyati, -te [761d1]; çitá, çiná, çyaná; çiyáte). freeze; coagulate.

çyená, *m.* eagle; falcon; hawk. [cf. ἰ-κτινο-s, 'kite.']

√ çrath (çrathnīte; çaçrathé; áçiçrathat; çrthitá). become loose.

çrād, *indecl.* meaning perhaps orig. heart; *used w. dhā* ('grant, give,' *see* √1dhā 4) *and dat. of person, thus, çrād asmāi dhatta*, (your) heart to him give ye, *i.e.* trust ye him, have faith in him, RV.ii. 12. 5; *ppl.* çrād-dadhat, trusting, trustful, 26²; *cf.* 1079².

[cf. καρδία, κῆρ, *κηρδ, Lat. *cor*, gen. *cord-is*, Lithuanian *szirdis*, Ger. *Herz*, Eng. *heart*: further, w. çrād-dhā, cf. Lat. *crēdere*, *cred-dere, 'trust': — the regular Skt. word for 'heart' is hṛd, and this can not be connected w. the above words, since they require in the Skt. an initial ç, *çrd or çrad.]

çraddhā, *f.* trust, faith; desire. [see çrād: 1147.]

çraddhivá, *a.* credible. [çraddhā, 1228a.]

√ çram (çrámyati [763]; çaçráma; áçramīt; çrāntá; -çrámya). be weary; take pains; *esp.* castigate one's self, 96¹⁰.
