

the womb and its fruit; cf. *gi-gu* and *gāva*, ‘young’; *kōw*, ‘be pregnant’; Lat. *in-ciens*, ‘pregnant’; (*b*) to strength and growth in general; cf. *gūra*, ‘man of might’; *gavas*, *gavistha*, *guna*; *kōpōs*, ‘might’; *kūma*, ‘swell, billow.’]

çūdrā, *m.* a man of the fourth caste, a Cūdra.

çūna, *n.* emptiness. [Vçū, 1177a.]

çūra, *a.* mighty, bold; *as m.* man of might, hero. [Vçū, 1188c: çūra is parallel w. *kū-po-s, ‘mighty,’ whence *rō kūp-os*, ‘might’ (cf. *aiσχ-ρό-s* w. *rō alσχ-οs*).]

çūrpa, *n.* a plaited basket for winnowing grain.

✓ 1 gr̄ (grnáti; gaqrē; ácarit; carisyáti, -te; círná [957b]; -çírya; çíryáte). crush; break; tear. [cf. Eng. *har-m*, which answers to a Skt. *çar-ma.] + vi, pass. be broken to pieces; perish, 60⁹.

+ sam, break (a bow); like zusammenbrechen.

✓ 2 gr̄, see grā, ‘boil.’

çf̄nḡa, *n.* horn.

çr̄nḡín, *a.* horned; *as m.* horned beast.

çrtá, see Vçrá.

çéva, *a.* kind; dear. [cf. givá.]

çesa, —1. *m. n.* rest, remainder, 68¹⁷; çese, like Ger. im Uebrigen, for the rest, 12¹⁰; —2. *a.* remaining, 55¹⁵. [Vlçis, ‘leave.’]

çéšas, *n.* offspring. [‘those whom one leaves behind him, one’s relicts,’ Vlçis, ‘leave.’]

çóka, *m.* pain, grief. [Vgue, 216. 1.]

çoka-ja, *a.* grief-born; çokajam vāri, grief-born water, i.e. tears, 10¹⁹.

çokárta, *a.* sorrow-stricken. [ärtä.]

çociš-keça, *a.* having flame-locks, with locks of flame. [çocis, 187: 1297, cf. 1280b.]

çocištha, *a.* most or bright flaming. [Vgue, 468.]

çocís, *n.* flame; beam; heat. [Vgue, 1153.]

çōna, —1. *a.* red, deep-red; —2. *m.* Sone or Red River, affluent of the Ganges. [prop. ‘flame-colored’. cf. ē-kau-σa, ‘burned,’ kāv-μa, ‘heat.’]

çōnita, *n.* blood; also *pl.* [çóna, 1176d.] çobhaná, *a.* beautiful. [V2 çubh, ‘adorn,’ 1150. 2a.]

çóbhiṣṭha, *a.* most swiftly moving onward or most beautiful, 78⁵, according as the word is referred to Vlçubh or to V2 çubh — see these. [468.]

✓ çeand (intens. *ppl.* cánicadat [1002c]). shine, glance. [for *skandh: cf. ξανθός, ‘gold-yellow’; καθαρός, Doric κοθ-αρός, ‘clear, clean, pure’; κάρδ-apos, ‘coal’; Lat. *cand-ēre*, ‘glow.’]

çeandrā, *a.* shining. [Vçeand, 1188a: cf. viçvá-çeandra, and candrā.]

✓ çeut (çcótati; euçéota; ácuçeutat; çeutitá). drip.

çeút, *vbl.* dripping. [Vçeut.]

çmaçāná, *n.* the place for burning the corpses and for burying the bones, cemetery.

çmáçru, *n.* beard.

✓ çyā or çī (gyáyati, -te [761d1]; çítá, çiná, gyāná; gyáte). freeze; coagulate.

çyená, *m.* eagle; falcon; hawk. [cf. i-kr̄ivo-s, ‘kite.’]

✓ çr̄ath (çr̄athníté; çagrathé; áçigrathat; çr̄thítá). become loose.

çrád, indecl. meaning perhaps orig. heart; used w. dhā (‘grant, give,’ see Vl dhā 4) and dat. of person, thus, çrád asmāi dhatta, (your) heart to him give ye, i.e. trust ye him, have faith in him, RV.ii. 12. 5; *ppl.* çrád-dadhat, trusting, trustful, 26²; cf. 1079².

[cf. kapðia, kñp, *kñpð, Lat. cor, gen. cord-is, Lithuanian szirdis, Ger. Herz, Eng. heart: further, w. çrád-dhā, cf. Lat. crēdere, *cred-dere, ‘trust’: — the regular Skt. word for ‘heart’ is hýd, and this can not be connected w. the above words, since they require in the Skt. an initial ç, *çrd or çrad.]

çraddhá, *f.* trust, faith; desire. [see çrád: 1147.]

çraddhivá, *a.* credible. [çraddhá, 1228a.]

✓ çram (çrámyati [763]; çagrámá; áçramít; çrántá; -çrámya). be weary; take pains; esp. castigate one’s self, 96¹⁰.
