Kumaraka m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Kauravya, one of those offered in the *sarpasatra* of Janamejaya 1.52.12, 11.

Kumuda¹ m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5. 101. 13, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7; also listed by Sūta among the sons of Kadrū 1. 31. 15; he, with other serpents, received the white snake issuing from the mouth of Balarāma and entering the ocean 16. 5. 14, 12.

Kumuda² m.: A mythical bird, living in the world of Suparnas 5. 99. 12, 1.

Born in the *kula* of Vainateya (Garuda), in the *vainta* of Kaśyapa; marked with śrī-vatsa, his deity is Viṣṇu; feeding on serpents; by action a Kṣatriya not obtaining Brahminhood because engaged in destroying kinsmen 5, 99, 2-8.

Kumuda³ m.: A mythical lordly elephant (vāraņasattama), living in pātāla 5. 97. 1.

Born in the vamsa of Supratīka, pointed out by Nārada to Mātali 5. 97. 15.

Kumuda⁴ m.: A monkey-chief.

Kept watch, with SugrIva and others, over the bodies of Rāma and Laksmana, fallen on the ground, tied with arrows by Indrajit 3. 273. 4, 1-3.

Kumudākṣa m.: A mythical serpent. Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Śaunaka 1. 31. 15, 2.

Kurara m.: A mythical serpent.

Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Śaunaka 1. 31. 15, 2.

Kulika m. : A mythical serpent.

Son of Kadrū, daughter of Daksa; listed among the Kādraveyas by Vaisampāyana at the request of Janamejaya 1. 59. 40, 13.

Kuśaka m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5, 101, 15, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7.

Kurma m. : A mythical serpent.

Son of Kadrū, daughter of Dakṣa; listed among the Kādraveyas by Vaiśampāyana at the request of Janamejaya 1. 59. 40, 13.

Krśa m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Airāvata, one of those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 10, 11, 1.

Kṛṣṇa m.: A mythical serpent. 2. 9. 8. Waits on Varuṇa in his sabhā without feeling fatigue (vigataklama) 2. 9. 11; description: marked with banner (patākin), and spots (maṇḍalin), hooded (phaṇavant) 2. 9. 10.

Kesarin m.: A monkey.

Hanumant begotten on the wife (kṣetra) of Kesarin by Vāyu 3, 147, 24.

Kailasaka m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavati Purī 5. 101. 11, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7.

Kotanaka m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5. 101. 12, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5 7; also listed among the sons of Kadrū by Sūta 1. 31. 8.

Kotika m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Vāsuki: one of those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janame-jaya; description: some snakes in this family were dark-red, others white in colour; terrific, huge, and having excess of poison (*viṣotbaṇa*) 1. 52. 5, 1, 4, 6.
