Purna m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Vāsuki, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; some of the serpents in this family were dark-red, some white; all were ferocious, huge, and having excess of poison (*visolbana*) 1. 52. 5, 4, 6.

Purnadamstra m.: A mythical serpent. Son of Kadru, listed by Suta among her sons at the request of Saunaka 1. 31. 12, 2.

Purnamukha m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Dhrtarāstra, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; described as 'fast as wind' (*vātavega*), 'having excess of poison' (*viṣolbaṇa*) 1. 52. 14, 13, 1

Purnangada m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kuta* of Dhṛtarāṣṭra, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; described as 'fast as wind' (*vātavega*) and 'having excess of poison' (*viṣolbana*) 1.52.14, 13, 1.

Prthuśravas m.: A mythical serpent.

One of those who received the white snake issuing from the mouth of Balarāma and entering the ocean 16. 5. 14, 12.

Paila m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Vāsuki, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacr-fice of Janamejaya; some of the serpents in this family were dark-red, some white; all were ferocious, huge, and having excess of poison (*visolbana*) 1. 52. 5, 4, 6.

Potaka m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5. 101. 11, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5, 101, 4, 17; description 5, 101, 5-7.

Prakalana m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Vāsuki, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; some of the serpents in this family were dark-red, others white; all were ferocious, huge, and having excess of poison (*visolbana*) 1.52.5, 4, 6.

Prabhakara m. A mythical serpent.

Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Saunaka 1. 31. 15, 2.

Pramoda m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Airāvata, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 10, 1, 3.

Praruja m.: A mythical bird.

He fought with Garuda when the latter was on his expedition to fetch amrta; Garuda killed Praruja inflicting wounds on him with wings, nails and beak 1. 28. 19, 20, 22. [According to Nī., name of a Yakṣa, cf. aśva-krandādayo nava yakṣāḥ on 1. 32. 18 Bom. Ed.].

Praliha m.: A mythical bird.

He fought with Garuda when the latter was on his expedition to fetch amrta; Garuda killed Praliha inflicting wounds on him with wings, nails and beak 1. 28. 19, 20, 22. [According to Nī., name of a Yakṣa, cf. atvakrandādayo nava yakṣāḥ on 1. 32. 18 Bom. Ed.].

Pravepana m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Taksaka, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 8, 7, 9.

Prahasa m.: A mythical serpent,
