Śarabha m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Airāvata, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 10, 11.

Salakara m.: A mythical serpent 1. 52.8?

Salapotaka m.: A mythical serpent. Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Saunaka 1.31.7,2.

Salyaka m. : A mythical serpent.

Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Śaunaka 1. 31. 13, 2.

Sasaroman m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the family of Takṣaka, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1, 52, 9, 7.

Śardūlī f.: A mythical female being.
One of the nine selfborn women (nārīḥ
... ātmasambhavāḥ), daughters of Krodhavaśā (or of Tāmrā (?) 1.60.54; in that case
krodhavaśā 'given to anger, irascible'); she
gave birth to lions, tigers and leopards 1.60.
58-59, 63.

Salipinda m.: A mythical serpent.

Strong (vīryavān) son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Saunaka 1.31.14, 2.

Sikhin m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavati Puri 5, 101, 12, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7.

Sitikantha m. : A mythical serpent.

One of those who received the white snake issuing from the mouth of Balarāma and entering the ocean; called *agratejas* 'having fierce lustre'; (or Agratejas a proper name?) 16. 5. 15, 12.

Sirīṣaka m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5. 101. 14, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7.

Silin m.: A mythical serpent 1.52,87 [See Silīśalakara]

Silisalakara m.: A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Taksaka, listed by

Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 8, 7, 9.

Sukī f. : A mythical bird.

One of the five famous daughters (lokavitrutāh) of the divine (devī) Tāmrā, she gave birth to parrots; described as 'spirited' (manasvinī), 'endowed with auspicious qualities' (kalyānaguṇasampannā), and 'adorned with all good marks' (sarvalakṣaṇa-pūjitā) 1.60.54,57.

Śrigavega m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Kauravya, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 12, 11.

Śesa m.: A mythical serpent (nāga 1. 32. 24 (= Ananta); 1. 61. 91; 3. 194. 9, 10, 14; 5. 101. 2; bhujamgama 1. 32. 14), sometimes identified with Ananta; living in Bhogayatī Purī 5. 101. 1, 2.

A. Birth and divine origin: Mentioned by Sūta as the first son of Kadrū, the second being Vāsuki (śesah prathamato jāto
