Son of Kadrū, listed among her sons by Sūta at the request of Śaunaka 1, 31, 10, 2.

Samvrtta m. : A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavatī Purī 5. 101. 14, 1.

Son of Surasā and Kasyapa 5. 101. 4, 17; description 5. 101. 5-7.

Samhatangada m: A mythical serpent. Born in the *kula* of Airavata, listed by Suta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya 1. 52. 10, 11.

Saptavara m: A mythical bird, living in the world of the Suparnas 5. 99. 11, 1.

Born in the kula of Vainateya (Garuḍa), in the vainsa of Kasyapa; feeding on serpents; marked with śrīvatsa, his deity is Viṣṇu; by action a Kṣatriya, not getting Brahminhood because engaged in killing his kinsmen 5.99.2-8.

Samrddha m. : A mythical serpent.

Born in the *kula* of Dhrtarastra, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; described as 'fast as wind' (*vātavega*), 'having excess of poison' (*viṣolbaṇa*) 1.52.16, 13.

Sampāti m.: A mythical vulture (gṛdhra 3. 147. 33).

A. Birth: Heroic and srtong son of Aruna and Syenī, elder brother of Jaṭāyus 1. 60. 67; 3. 263. 1; 3. 266 48. B. Description and Eminence: Of terrible and fearful appearance, he looked like a peak of a mountain or like another Vainateya (Garuda) 3. 266. 46; mentioned as 'king of birds' (khayādhipa 3. 266. 48; pakṣirāj 3. 266. 54). C. Meeting with monkey-chiefs: He approached Hanumant and other monkey-chiefs with a view to eating them when they talked about Jaṭāyu; he asked them who they

were talking about his brother and introduced himself to them as Sampāti and the elder brother (jyestho bhrātā 3, 266, 48) of Jatavu: he informed them about his contest with his brother in which they flew up to the assembly hall of the Sun (adityasamsad 3. 266. 48); as a result his wings were burnt but not of Jatavus; with his wings burnt down he fell on the mountain Malava: he had not met his brother for quite a long time; he was then informed by Hanumant and others that his brother was dead: dejected to hear the sad news he asked the monkey-chiefs about Rāma and Sītā and how his brother got killed; on hearing Rama's story Sampāti asked the monkey-chiefs to get up and told them that he knew Ravana and had seen his Lanka on the other shore of the ocean: he was sure that Sītā would be there and had no doubt about it: having heard Sampati's words Hanumant and others took counsel among themselves how they could cross the ocean 3, 266, 46-56; 3, 147, 33 (Sampāti not named, but referred to as grdhra).

Sampratipattijna adj.: 'One who takes the right judgement, who has the presence of mind'.

One of the three fishes of the Sakula type is so characterized (the other two being characterized as Dīrghadarśī and Dīrghasūtraḥ) 12. 135. 9. [See Pratipattimant 12. 135. 13; Sampratipattimant, Śakula]

Sampratipattimant adj.: 'One who has the right judgement' 12. 135. 15.

Saramā f.: A mythical bitch of the gods (devasunī 1. 3. 9, mātā sunām devī 3. 219. 33).
