Born in the *kula* of Dhṛtarāṣṭra, listed by Sūta among those offered in the snake sacrifice of Janamejaya; described as 'fast as wind' (*vātarega*), 'having excess of poison' (*viṣolbaṇa*) 1. 52. 17, 13.

Sumukha¹ m.: A mythical serpent, living in Bhogavati Puri 5. 101. 23, 1.

A. Birth: Born in the kula of Airavata, grandson of Aryaka, son of Cikura: his mother was the daughter of Vamana 5. 101. 23, 24; his father was killed by Vainateya (Garuda) 5. 101. 24. B. Eminence: A big snake (mahānāga 5. 103. 5); excellent snake, king or chief of snakes (bhujagottama 5. 101. 25; nāgarāj 5. 101. 23; nāgapati 5. 101, 26). C. Description; Lustrous, pleasing to look at 5. 101. 19; high banner of his race (vanisasya mahān ketubhūtah) 5. 101. 20; he impressed Mātali with such qualities as attentiveness, fortitude, handsomeness and young age (pranidhānena dhairyena rūpena vayasā ca me / manah pravistah) 5. 101. 21; also marked with such qualities as good character, purity and self-control (sumukhasya gunais caiva sīlasaucadamādibhih) 5. 102. 10. D. Marriage with Gunakesī: Mātali while searching in the Nāgaloka a bride-groom for his daughter Gunakes I happened to notice the serpent Sumukha in Bhogavatī Purī; he was happy to see him 5. 101. 22; when told by Narada who Sumukha was, Mātali chose him as his son-inlaw; he told Nārada accordingly and requested Narada to make effort to obtain Sumukba 5. 101. 21, 25, 26; Narada approached Aryaka, Sumukha's grand-father, and told him what Mātali had in mind; Āryaka was told that although Sumukha had no father he was chosen by Matali on account of his good qualities 5, 101, 6, 10; Aryaka was happy to hear the proposal but he was distressed because Garuda had announced his intention to eat up Sumukha after a month 5. 102. 15; 5. 103. 5; the threat was bound to come true as Garuda wanted to feed his large progeny by killing Sumukha 5. 102. 16; 5. 103. 5; Mātali then proposed to take Sumukha with him to meet Indra and make effort to prolong the remaining life-span of Sumukha and thwart Garuda in carrying out his threat 5, 102, 17-21; Visnu, who happened to be present when all met Indra, asked Indra to give amrta to Sumukha and make him (immortal) like other gods; Visqu desired Sumukha and the rest to get what they wanted: Indra, however, asked Visnu himself to give amrta to Sumukha: when asked by Visnu again, Indra gave only long life (ayur uttamam 5. 102, 27) to Sumukha but not amrta: on obtaining the boon Sumukha's face shone with brilliance (labdhvā varam tu sumukhah sumukhah sambabhūva ha 5. 102. 28); having obtained wife as desired Sumukha went home 5, 102, 23-28; Garuda was extremely angry to know that he was deprived of Sumukha; he blamed Indra for acting as he willed and announced that since Sumukha was no longer available to him he would not kill any other serpent 5. 103. 1, 2, 6, 15.

Sumukha² m. : A mythical bird.

One of the six sons of Valnateya (Garuda), who extended the kula of Suparnas 5.99.2; 6.7.12; Sumukha saw that all birds on mount Meru were of gold (sauvarnān prekṣya vāyasān); he therefore felt that mount Meru made no distinction between good, middling, and low birds and hence left it 6.7.12-13.

Sumukha³ m.: A mythical bird living in the world of Suparnas 5. 99. 12, 1.
