Vāruṇa⁴ adj.: of the conch Devadatta 2. 3. 7. [See Devadatta and Vāruṇa⁵]

Varuna⁵ adj.: of the conch of Varuna (?).

Prajāpati in a previous age got it for Indra; the ocean (kalasodadha) brought it for Yudhisthira for his anointment at the Rājasūya (kalaśodadhih samudrah Nī. on Bom. Ed. 2.53.15; however Ni. on Bom. Ed. 2. 49. 26. kalaša iva kalašo jalapūrņatvāt samudrah / ... anye tu kalaśodadhih it was well-fashioned samudrah): Visvakarman and was set with a thousand niskas (siktam niskasahasrena sukrtam viśvakarmanā); with this Vāruņa conch Kṛṣṇa anointed Yudhisthira 2. 49. 14-15; however, according to 2. 45. 26-27 the ocean (kalaśodadhi) brought a Vāruna drinking vessel made of brass (kāmsyam ... vārunam) to Yudhisthira; it was probably brought in a sling made of a thousand rukmas and adorned with many jewels 2. 45, 26-27.

Vāruņāstra, Vāruņa astra nt.: Name of the missile related to Varuņa.

A. Description: heavenly (divya) 5. 181. 13; 6. 116. 38; 7. 73. 46; 12. 5. 13-14; fierce (ghora) 7. 53. 43. B. Knowledge: (1) Drona knew the use of the Vāruna astra 7. 166. 2; (2) Arjuna, after reaching the residence of Indra, was to learn the Astra from Varuna 3. 164. 29; Arjuna told Uttara that he received the Vāruna astra from Varuna 4. 56. 14; 7. 53. 43; 12. 5. 13-14; Vāruna astra included among the group of missiles (astragrāmah) known to Arjuna 5. 181. 11; according to Bhīsma known only to Arjuna, and perhaps to Kṛṣṇa 6. 116. 38-39; but it was apparently also known to Rāma Jāmadagnya, Bhīsma, Droṇa, Sātyaki,

Sikhandin, Yudhisthira (?) and Karna (see the next section C): C. Use: (1) In the epic war: (i) by Drona: one of the missiles used against Yudhisthira with the intention of killing him (jighāmsuh) 7. 132. 29; against Arjuna 7. 163.28: (il) by Arjuna: used by Arjuna, according to prescriptions. to repel the same (?) missile used by Drona against him (muktam muktam dronacāpāt taj jaghāna dhanamjayah // astrāny astrair yadā tasya vidhivad dhanti pāndavah) 7. 163. 28-29; to protect Bhīma from the fire of the Nārāyanāstra 7. 171. 1; (iii) Sātyaki employed the Varuna astra to pacify the Agneya astra, used by Drona āgneyam mahāghoram ripughnam upalaksya sah / astram divyam mahesvāso vāruņam samudairayat ... astre te vāruņāgneye tābhyām bānasamāhite) 7.73.46,48; (lv) Sikhandin used it to repel a powerful missile used against him by Salya 6.81.25-27; (v) Karna used this missile to extinguish the fire caused by the Astra of Jatavedas (Agneyāstra) employed by Arjuna 8. 67. 10; Arjuna nullified its effects by the Vayavyastra 8. 67. 11; (vi) Yudhisthira successfully combated the different missiles - one of them being Varuna - used against him by Drona by using the same (?) missiles (tāni cāstrāni dharmajah | jaghānāstrair mahābāhuh) 7.132.30. (2) Outside the epic war: used by Rama Jāmadagnya against Bhisma to repulse his Agneya astra 5. 181.12; (ii) Bhīsma used this missile against Salva and with it crushed the four horses of Salva 1. 96. 37; against Arjuna at the cattle-raid 4. 59. 21; (iii-) Arjuna used it against Bhīsma on the same occasion 4. 59. 21; Arjuna demonstrated it at the time of showing his skill in the use of
