D. Epic event: The above arms were brought as tribute for Yudhişthira by the people who came for his Rājasūya (balim ca kṛtsnam ādāya dvāri tiṣṭhanti vāritāḥ) 2. 47. 25.

Abhīsāra m. (pl.): Name of a Janapada.

A. Location: Listed by Samjaya among the (northern) Janapadas of the Bharatavarsa (ata urdhvam janapadan nibodha gadato mama) 6. 10. 37, 5; (abhisārāh kulūtās ca) 6. 10. 52. B. Characteristic: They are described as haughty, fond of battles, strong and having firm (?) hands (samrambhino yuddhasaunda balino drdhapānayah) 8. 51. 19. C. Epic event: Mentioned among those who fought against Arjuna; struck by his arrows they fled in fear (dārvābhisārā daradāh) 7. 68. 42; (sarais ca sataso viddhās ... prādravanta rane bhitāh) 7. 68. 45; pointed out to Arjuna by Kṛṣṇa among those who had gathered round the Kurus to help Suyodhana (darvābhisarā daradāh ... ete suyodhanasyarthe samrabdhah kurubhih saha) 8. 51. 18, 20.

Abhīṣāha m. (pl.): Name of a Janapada and its people; mentioned almost always along with Śūrasenas, Śibis and Vasātis (in 7. 132. 24 Bāhlīkas appear in place of Śibis).

A. Characteristic: They are counted twice among the twelve Janapadas (abhi-

şāhāh sūrasenāh... dvādasaite janapadāh) 6. 18. 12-13; 6. 114. 76-77; Kşatriyas (7. 136. 4), distinguished by their armour, they are said to be brave, ready to die in battle ( sūrās tanutyajah 6. 18. 14) and haughty due to pride (abhī ṣāhāh kavacinah praharanto madotkațāh) 8. 4. 37; very much excited in battle (abhi sāhān ... yuddhadurmadan) 7. 136. 4; strong (balavantah) 6. 112. 107; they ranked as mahārathas 6. 112, 107, 111. B. Epic events: (1) Abhlsahas, Surasenas, Sibis and Vasatis were among the thousands of charioteers who followed Duhsasana and other heroes acting as rear-guards (prsihagopāh 6. 18. 10) of Bhisma (rathā vimsatisāhāsrās ... abhi sāhāh sūrasenāh sibayo 'tha vasātayah // ... mahatā rathavamsena te 'bhyarakşan pitāmaham) 6.18,10,12,14; (2) On the ninth day of the war, Abhisahas, Surasenas and others did not run away from Bhisma though they were being killed by the sharp arrows of the Pandavas (abhisāhāh sūrasenāh sibayo 'tha vasātayah / samgrāme nājahur bhişmam vadhyamānāh sitaih saraih // ... vadhyamānāh pāndaveyair mahātmabhih) 6. 102. 7-8; (3) On the tenth day of the war, Abhlsahas, Śurasenas, Śibis and Vasatis attacked Arjuna as the moths jump on fire; they were burnt by Arjuna with his heavenly missiles; struck by Arjuna the charioteers fell down with their standards, the horseriders with their horses, and the elephantriders with their elephants (abhi ṣāhāḥ sūrasenāh sibayo 'tha vasātayah |... abhipetū rane partham patanga iva pavakam //) 6. 112. 109-112; (sadhvajā rathinah petur havaroha hayaih saha | gajah saha gajarohaik) 6. 112. 115; (4) On the tenth
