the side of the Kauravas with sixty thousand chariot-fighters and an ayuta of elephant warriors (sastyā rathasahasrais tu nāgānām ayutena ca | patih sarvakalingānām yayau ketumatā saha) 6. 17. 32; (9) On the second day of the war, the Kalinga king and his army attacked Bhima and an extremely fierce battle took place between them (kalingam samacodayat |... tatah sā mahatī senā kalingānām ... bhī mam abhyudyayau turnam ... || tatah pravavrte yuddham tumulam lomaharşanam | kalingānām ca samare bhi masya ca ... | jagatah praksayakaram ghorarūpam bliayānakam //) 6. 49. 37-38, 40; 6. 50, 1-3; Bhima met the sudden advance of the large force of the Kalingas which was full of chariots, elephants and horses and fighting with large weapons (tām āpatantīm sahasā kalingānām mahācamum | rathanāgāśvakalilām pragrhitamahāyudhām /) 6.50.4-5; (rathair anekasāhasraih kalingānām janādhipah) 6.50.7; the battle was fierce 6. 50. 9-14; the large army of the Kalingas and the Nisadas was engaged with the small one of the Cedis (alpānām bahubhih saha | kalingaih saha cedīnām niṣādaiś ca) 6.50.14; when the Cedis retired, Bhima did not leave the battle but showered arrows on the Kalinga army (sarvaih kalingair āsannah samnivrtteşu cedişu | ... na nyavartata pandavah ... sitair avākiran bāņaih kalingānām varūthinīm // ... yodhayām āsa kāliṅgān) 6. 50. 16-17, 19; the king of the Kalingas obstructed Bhima on all sides with his many thousands of chariots (kalinganam janādhipah | rathair anekasāhasrair bhīmasyāvārayad dišah) 6.50.23; Bhīma frightened the army of the Kalingas by loud roars; the army thought him to be superhuman (tena śabdena vitrastā kalingānām varūthini na bhimam samare mene mānusam) 6. 50. 33, 27; the fierce battle in which the king of the Kalingas died described in 6. 50. 39-59; the Kalinga army. then led by Śrutāyus, attacked Bhima (sā bahulā senā kalingānām tarasvinām | ... bhi masenam upādravat); (kalingasainyānām pramukhe ... śrutāyuşam abhiprekşya) 6. 50. 60-61; they used śakti, gadā, tomara, rsti and parasvadha against Bhima 6.50. 71-72; Bhima killed with his gadā first seven hundred of them (saptaśatān virān 6. 50. 73) and then two thousad of them (dvisāhasrān kalingān ... | prāhinon mṛtyulokāya) 6. 50. 73-75; while fighting with Bhlma, the Kalinga army was confused and it trembled (mohaś cāpi kalingānām āviveša ... prākampata ca sainyāni) 6. 50. 77-78, 80; they fled, but returned again in groups (punar āvartamānesu vidravatsu ca samghasah) 6. 50. 81; Dhrstadyumna ordered his army to fight with the Kalinga warriors (sarvakālingayodhesu ... yudliyadhvam) 6. 50. 82; Dhrstadyumna went to help Bhima who was attacked by the Kalingas, (kalingesu carantam ... kalingaih samabhidrutam) 6, 50. 87, 90; Sātyaki saw both of them fighting with the Kalingas; he himself killed some of the adversaries (kalingan samare vīrau yodhayantau ... jaghāna samare parān) 6. 50. 91, 93; Bhima caused a river of blood rising from the fallen Kalingas to flow between the army of the Kalingas and of the Pandavas; it appeared as if it was Kāla fighting with the Kalingas (kalingaprabhavām ... rudhirasyandinīm tatra bhi mah pravartayan nadim | antarena kalingānām pāndavānām ca vāhinīm ... prākrošams tāvakā ... | kālo 'yam bhima-
