that he (Kṛṣṇa) would fell down Bhisma and Drona (drstvā kurūn āpatatah samantāt) 6.55.81: when Kṛṣṇa, holding cakra in his hand, rushed towards Bhisma, all beings raised their voice apprehending the destruction of the Kurus 6.55.91; Arjuna promised Kṛṣṇa that he would bring about the end of the Kurus 6. 55. 100; the Kuru chief warriors (kurupravirāh) again raised their voice when Kṛṣṇa was back in his chariot; their voice was mixed with the loud sound of the mrdanga, bheri, pataha, and dundubhi, and also the one made by the chariotrims 6. 55. 103-104; the Kurus along with Bhisma and others retired from the battlefield at sun-set 6, 55. 128; seeing Arjuna retire, a loud sound in the evening went up from the side of the Kurus, and they retired 6. 55. 129, 132; on the fourth day of the war, the army of the Kurus, very dreadful and protected by Bhisma, suddenly rushed towards Arjuna (senā mahogrā sahasā kurūnām ... prayātā praty arjunam) 6. 56. 6; the Kurus and Srnjayas watched the duel between Bhisma and Dhanamjaya 6. 56. 28; Kurus and Pandavas watched the duel between Sāmyamani and Dhṛṣṭadyumna 6. 57. 34; Sātyaki routed the principal Kuru warriors 6. 59. 27; Kurus and Pandaveyas killed one another (kuravah pāndaveyās ca ) 6. 68. 12; Srnjayas, with their hair loose and deprived of their armour, chariot and bows, wrestled with the Kurus (bāhubhih samayudhyanta srnjayāh kurubhih saha) 6. 69. 39; the armies of the Pandavas and Kurus retired to their camps (at the end of the fifth day of the war) 6. 70. 36-37; next day, they came out again for battle 6. 71.1; when Dhrstadyumna fixed sammohanāstra on his bow, all Kurus fled with their horses, elephants and chariots 6. 73. 43; many headless trunks appeared all around in the armies of the Kurus and Pandavas (uttasthuh samare tatra kabandhani samantatah) 6. 74. 31; when Bhima raised his gada, Kurus fled in all directions 6. 81. 33; the Pandavas and Kurus retired to their camps (at the end of the seventh day of war); next day, they again came out for battle 6. 82. 52; 6. 83. 1; Kuru and Pandava forces killed one another with all sorts of fierce weapons 6. 83. 36; Kurus and Pāndavas withdrew their armies for the day (at the end of the eighth day) and retired to their camps (tato 'vahāram sainyānām pracakruh kurupāndavāh) 6, 92, 78-79; Duryodhana, respected by the Kurus, left for the camp of Bhisma 6. 93. 26; Kurus and Pandavas fought one another at midday (of the ninth day of war) 6. 100. 15: Arjuna and Bhisma routed respectively the armies of Kurus and Pandavas (yathā kurunām sainyāni babhanja yudhi pandavah | tathā pāṇḍavasainyāni babhañja yudhi te pitā //) 6. 102. 73; Bhīsma retired to his camp along with the delighted Kurus (at the end of the ninth day) 6. 103. 9; placing Bhisma in the forefront, Kurus marched against the Pandavas (on the tenth day) 6. 104. 11; Arjuna assured Sikhandin that he would check all the Kurus (the term includes Drona, Asvatthaman, Krpa, Duryodhana, Citrasena, Vikarna, Jayadratha (a Saindhava), Vinda and Anuvinda (both Avantyas), Sudaksina (a Kāmboja), Bhagadatta, a Māgadha (not named), Saumadatti, Arsyasrngi (a Rāksasa), Trigartarāja and their armies) 6. 104. 55-58; seeing the battle between Bhisma, helped
