काश्यपिन्, īnas, m. pl., N. of a school called after Kāsyapa.

काश्यापिया, āś, m. pl., N. of a Buddhist school called after Kāsyapa.

काश्यापेया, āś, m. (a patronymic fr. *kāsyapa*), an epithet of the twelve Ādityas; also of the sun; and of Garuda, the bird of Vishnu.

काश्वरी kāśvarī, f. the plant *Gmelina arborea*, = *kāśmari*.

काष kāśha, as, m. (fr. rt. *kash*), rubbing; that against which anything is rubbed.

काषाय kāshāya, as, ī, am (fr. *kashāya*), red, dyed of a reddish colour; a red cloth or garment; (ī), f. (with *makshikā*) a sort of fly or wasp.

— **Kāshāya-grahāpa, as, m.** N. of a Cāitya, q. v.

— **Kāshāya-vasana, as, āś, am,** having a dark or brown garment. — **Kāshāya-vāśikā, as, m.** a kind of poisonous insect.

काश्याया, as, m. (a patronymic fr. *kashāya* or *kāshāya*), N. of a teacher.

काश्यायैn, īnas, m. pl., N. of a school called from Kashaya.

काश kāshīha, as, m. (said to be fr. rt. *kāś*; cf. *kāshīhā* next col.), N. of one of Kuvera's attendants; (am), n. a piece of wood or timber, a stick; wood or timber in general; an instrument for measuring lengths; a kind of measure; (metaphorically) a mere stick, a lanky thin man. At the beginning of a compound and before a simple verb *kāshīha* may express excellence or superiority; [cf. Cambro-Brit. *coed*; Brit. *coat*; Gr. *ξέλων*.] — **Kāshīha-kadālī**, f. the wild plantain, *Musa Sapientum*, (the fruit of this plant being hard and woody.) — **Kāshīha-kīṭa, as, m.** a small insect or worm found in decayed wood.

— **Kāshīha-kūṭī** or *kāshīhā-kūṭā*, as, m. a bird, a sort of woodpecker, *Picus Bengalenesis*. — **Kāshīha-kuddālā, as, m.** a kind of wooden shovel or scraper used for baling water out of a boat, or for scraping and cleaning its bottom; also written *kūḍālā* or *kūḍālā*. — **Kāshīha-khāṇḍa, am, n.** a stick, a spar, a piece of wood. — **Kāshīha-ghāṭīta, as, āś, am**, formed of wood, woodoo. — **Kāshīha-jambū, ūś, f.** N. of a tree, = *bhūmi-jambū*. — **Kāshīha-takshī, t, m.** or *kāshīha-takshāka*, as, m. a carpenter. — **Kāshīha-tantu, us, m.** a caterpillar which secretes itself in wood and there passes into a chrysalis; a small worm found in timber. — **Kāshīha-dārū, us, m.** the tree *Pinus Deodora*. — **Kāshīha-dru, us, m.** the tree *Butea Frondosa*. — **Kāshīha-dhātri-phala, am, n.** the fruit of the plant *Emblica officinalis*. — **Kāshīha-pāṭalā, f.** N. of a plant (*sita-pāṭalikā*). — **Kāshīha-pāshāna-vāśas, āśi**, p. pl. wood, stone, and clothes. — **Kāshīha-puttālikā, f.** a wooden image. — **Kāshīha-prādāna, am, n.** piling up wood, forming a funeral pile. — **Kāshīha-bhāra, as, m.** a particular weight of wood. — **Kāshīha-bhārīka, as, m.** a wood-carrier; a bearer of wood. — **Kāshīha-bhūṭā, as, āś, am**, one who has become wood, or who is like a piece of wood; epithet of an ascetic, who stands without stirring; (as), m., N. of a divine being. — **Kāshīha-bhṛīt**, see under *kāshīhā*. — **Kāshīha-matī, f.** a funeral pile. — **Kāshīha-maya, as, ī, am**, made of wood, wooden, consisting of pieces of wood. — **Kāshīha-malla, as, m.** a bier, a plank &c. on which dead bodies are carried. — **Kāshīha-rajju, us, m. or f. (?)**, a rope for binding together pieces of wood. — **Kāshīha-lekhaka, as, m.** a small worm found in wood. — **Kāshīha-lohin, ī, m.** a club, a short cudgel, especially if armed with iron. — **Kāshīha-vat, āś, ati, at**, having wood for fuel &c.; (*vat*), ind. like a piece of wood, like a stick or stock, standing petrified with fear &c. — **Kāshīha-vallīkā, f.** N. of a plant, = *katukā*. — **Kāshīha-vāla, as or am, m. or n. (?)**, a wall made of wood; N. of a place (?). — **Kāshīha-vivara, am, n.** the hollow of a tree. — **Kāshīha-sārivā, f.** N. of a plant, = *sārivā*.

— **Kāshīha-stambha, as, m.** a beam of wood. — **Kāshīhāgāra (°ha-ag°)**, as or am, m. or n. a house of wood, a wooden house or enclosure. — **Kāshīhāvāhīni (°ha-am°)**, f. a wooden bucket or baling vessel; [cf. *ambu-vāhīni*.] — **Kāshīhāluka (°ha-āl°)**, as or am, m. or n. a species of Aluka. — **Kāshīhēshu (°ha-ih°)**, us, m. a kind of sugar-cane. — **Kāshīhaka, am, n.** aloe wood or Agallochum. — **Kāshīhika, as, m.** a bearer of wood; (āś), f. a small piece of wood.

Kāshīhin, ī, īnī, ī, wooden; having wood.

काश kāshīhā, f. [cf. *kāshīha* last col.], a place for running, a race-ground, course; the course, path or track of the wind and clouds in the atmosphere; a quarter or region of the world, a cardinal point, space, tract; water; the mark, the goal; limit, boundary; the sun; a fixed place, place, site, especially the situation of the lunar mansions; a measure of time, = $\frac{1}{3}$ Kalā, = $\frac{1}{8}$ Laghu, = $\frac{1}{24}$ Nādiā, = $\frac{1}{48}$ Muhūrtā; the plant *Curcuma Xanthorrhiza*; N. of a daughter of Daksha and wife of Kāsyapa, mother of the solidungulous quadrupeds; N. of a town. — **Kāshīhābhṛīt, ī, t, t** (for *kāshīhā-bhṛīt*), Ved. leading to a mark or aim.

काशील kāshīhīla (kā-ash°), as, m. a large kind of Calotropis; (āś), f. a plantain, *Musa Sapientum*.

कास t, kāś, cl. 1. A. kāsate, cākāse or *kāsāmāśa*, kāsīshyate, akāsīshā, kāsītum, to cough; to make any disagreeable sound or one indicating disease; to shine (for rt. *kāś*, q. v.): Caus. kāsāyatī, yitum: Desid. cākāshate: Intens. cākāseyate, cākāsti; [cf. Lith. kōstu, kōseti; Slav. kājlyati; Old Germ. huostu; Scot. casad.]

1. *kāśa, as, āś, m. f.* cough, catarrh. — **Kāśa-kanda, as, m.** a species of root, = *kāśālū*. — **Kāśa-kara, as, ī, am**, producing cough or catarrh. — **Kāśa-kunīha, as, āś, am**, afflicted with cough; (as), m. an epithet of Yama; [cf. *kāśa*.] — **Kāśa-ghna, as, ī, am**, removing or alleviating cough, pectoral; (ī), f. a sort of prickly nightshade, *Solanum Jacquini*. — **Kāśa-jit, t, f.** the plant *Clerodendrum Siphonanthus*. — **Kāśa-nāśīnī, f.** N. of a thorny plant, = *karkata-sringī*. — **Kāśa-marda, as, m.** the plant *Cassia Sopora*; a remedy against cough, an acid preparation, a mixture of tamarinds and mustard; also = *pafala*. — **Kāśa-mardaku, as, m.** the plant *Cassia Sopora*. — **Kāśa-mardana, as, m.** the plant *Trichosanthes Dicocca*. — **Kāśa-vat, āś, ati, at**, having a cough. — **Kāśāri (°sa-āri)**, is, m. the plant *Cassia Sopora*. — **Kāśālū (°sa-ālu)**, us, m. an esculent root, a sort of yam.

Kāśikā, f. cough.

Kāśin, ī, īnī, ī, having a cough.

Kāśundivātīkā, f. a remedy against cough, an acid preparation, a mixture of tamarinds and mustard; (perhaps a wrong reading for *kāsandi*).

कास 2. kāśa, as, am, m. n. (for *kāśa*), a species of reed or long grass, *Saccharum Spontaneum*; another plant, *Hyperanthera Moringa*.

कासर kāśara, as, m. a buffalo; (fr. *ka*, water, and *sara*, going?; this animal being partial to marshy places.)

कासार kāśāra, as, am, m. n. (said to be fr. rt. *kāś*), a pond, a pool.

कासीराम kāśīrāma, as, m., N. of a man; (more correctly *kāśī-rāma*?).

कासीस kāśīsa, am, n. green vitriol, green sulphate of iron; [cf. *kāśīsa*.]

कास 3. kāśū, ūś, f. (fr. rt. *kāś?*), a sort of spear or lance; indistinct speech; speech in general; light, lustre; disease; devotion; understanding. — **Kāśū-tarī, f.** a short spear, a javelin.

कासृति kāśīti, is, f. a by-way, a secret path.

कास्तीर kāśītira, am, n., N. of a town.

काहका kāhakā, f. a kind of musical instrument; [cf. *kāhālā*.]

काहल kāhala, as, ī, am, dry, withered; large, excessive; mischievous; (as), m. a cat; a cock; a sound in general; (āś), f. a kind of musical instrument; N. of an Apsaras; (ī), f. a young woman; (am), n. indistinct speech; a kind of musical instrument; (as, ī, am), m. f. n. a horn, either a cow-horn or an instrument of that shape; a large drum; (am), ind. much, excessively. — **Kāhāl-pushpa, as, m. a thorn-apple, *Datura Metel*; *dhūstūra*. — **Kāhalin, ī, m.** N. of a Rishi.**

काहलि kāhali, is, m. an epithet of Siva.

काहबाह kāhābāha, am, n., Ved. a rumbling noise in the bowels.

काही kāhī, f. the plant *Wrightia Antidysenterica*; [cf. *kutaja*.]

काहृजी kāhūjī, īs, m., N. of the father of the writer Mahadeva (author of an astronomical work).

कि 1. ki, a pronominal base, like *ka* and *ku*, in the words *kim*, *kiyat*, *kis*, *kīdriksha*, *kīdrīsa*, *kīvat*, q. v.

कि 2. ki, a verbal root; [cf. ē; Lat. *scio*?; Hib. *cī*; 'see, behold'; *ci-thī*, 'you see'; *cīcar*, 'it seems, appears.')

किस्त्र kīnstya, am, n. a kind of fruit (?).

किकि kiki, is, m. a blue jay; the cocoa tree, *Nārikela*; [cf. the following.]

किकिरा kikidīrī, is, m. or *kikidīrī*, īs, m. a blue jay; Ved. another kind of animal.

Kikin, ī, m. or *kikī*, f. a blue jay.

Kikidīrīva, as, m. or *kikidīrīvi* or *kikidīrīvi*, īs, m. a blue jay.

किकिरा kikirā, ind., Ved. (with 1. *kri*) to tear in pieces, to rend into rags and tatters.

किकिटा kikkītā, ind., Ved. an onomatopoetic word used like an interjection in invocations.

किक्किश kikkīśa, as, m. a kind of worm, pernicious to the hair, nails, and teeth.

किक्किसाद kikkīsāda, as, m. a species of snake.

किक्कनस kiknasa, as, m. particles of ground corn, bruised grain, groats.

किकि kikhi, is, m. a monkey, an ape; (is), f. a small jackal, a fox.

किक्कनी kinkānī, f. a small bell; (a various reading for *kinkīnī*, q. v.)

किक्कर kin-kara, &c. See under *kim* below.

किक्किणा kinkīṇā, as, m. (an onomatopoetic word), a kind of musical instrument; N. of a son of Bhajamāna.

Kinkīūti, is or ī, f. a small bell; a girdle of small bells, or any tinkling ornament; N. of an acid sort of grape (*Vikan-kata*).

Kinkīūka, as or am, m. or n. (?), a small bell.

Kinkīnīkāśrama (°ka-āś°), as, m. N. of an hermitage.

Kinkīnīkin, ī, īnī, ī, ornamented or decorated with small bells.

किकिर kinkīra, as, m. a horse; the Indian cuckoo, the Kokila or Koil; a large black bee; Kāma-deva, the god of love; (āś), f. blood; (am), n. the frontal sinus of an elephant.

Kinkīrāta, as, m. a parrot; the Indian cuckoo or Kokila; Kāma-deva, the god of love; the tree *Jonesia Aśoka*; a species of amaranth; [cf. *kuraṇtaka*, *vaktāmlāna*, *pītāmlāna*.]

Kinkīrāla, as, m., N. of a plant, = *varvūra*.

Kinkīrin, ī, m., N. of a plant, commonly Buinchī, Flacourtie Sapida; [cf. *rikankata*.]
