'flower-basket,' N. of a grove in the vicinity of Avantī or Onjein sacred to Mahā-deva. — *Pushpa-karaṇḍinī*, f. a N. of Onjein. — *Pushpa-karṇa*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. having a flower (i. e. a flower-shaped mole or mark) in the ear (said of an animal). — *Pushpa-kāra*, *as*, m. the author of the *Pushpa-sūtras*. — *Pushpa-kāla*, *as*, m. 'flower-time,' the spring; the time of the menses. — *Pushpa-kāśīca*, *am*, n. green or black sulphate of iron. — *Pushpa-kīṭa*, *as*, m. 'flower-insect,' a large black bee; an insect living in flowers. — *Pushpa-ketana*, *as*, m. 'characterized by flowers,' the god of love. — *Pushpa-ketu*, *us*, m. 'characterized by flowers,' an epithet of the god of love; N. of a Buddha; of a prince; calx of brass; vitriol used for collyrium. — *Pushpa-gaṇḍikā*, f. contrary purpose or effort of man and woman. — *Pushpa-giri*, *is*, m. 'flower-mountain,' N. of a fabulous mountain (the favourite resort of Varuṇa). — *Pushpa-grīha*, *am*, n. 'flower-house,' a conservatory. — *Pushpa-granthana*, *am*, n. weaving a wreath or garland of flowers. — *Pushpa-gṛhātaka*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for its destroyer,' the bamboo (the stem of which is said to decay after the plant has flowered). — *Pushpa-śāya*, *as*, m. a quantity of flowers; gathering flowers. — *Pushpa-śāpa*, *as*, m. a bow of flowers, the bow of the god of love; 'having a bow of flowers,' an epithet of Kāma-deva the god of love. — *Pushpa-śāmara*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for a chowrie,' the plant *Artemisia Indica*; a fragrant plant, *Pandanus Odoratissimus*. — *Pushpa-ja*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, derived or coming from flowers (e. g. *pushpajam rajah*, dust derived from flowers, pollen); (*as*), m. the juice of flowers; (*ā*), f., N. of a river rising in the Vindhya mountains. — *Pushpa-jāti*, *is*, f. 'flower-born,' N. of a river rising in the Malaya mountains. — *Pushpa-da*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, giving blossoms or flowers; (*as*), m. a tree. — *Pushpa-danṣhtra*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for fangs,' N. of a serpent-demon. — *Pushpa-danta*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for teeth,' N. of one of Siva's attendants; of a Gandharva and author of the Mahimnaḥ Stavah; of an attendant of Viṣṇu (who is described as fighting against the Asuras); (with Jains) the ninth Arhat of the present Ava-sarpīṇī; N. of a Vidyā-dhara; of the elephant of the north-west quarter; of a serpent-demon; of the mountain Satruñ-jaya; (*au*), m. du. the sun and moon; (*ī*), f., N. of a Rākshasi; (*am*), n., N. of a temple; of a palace; of a city gate (Hari-vaṅśa 6510). — *Pushpa-dantaka*, *as*, m., N. of a Gandharva and author of the Mahimnaḥ Stavah. — *Pushpadanta-tīrtha*, *am*, n., N. of a sacred bathing-place. — *Pushpadanta-bhīd*, *t*, m. an epithet of Siva; (perhaps wrongly for *piśhā-danta-bhīd*, cf. *piśhā-danta-hara*). — *Pushpa-dāman*, *ā*, n. a garland or chaplet of flowers; a kind of metre, four times -----, 000000, 0-0-0-0. — *Pushpa-drava*, *as*, m. the exudation or saccharine matter of flowers; an infusion of flowers, as rose-water &c. — *Pushpa-druma*, *as*, m. a flowering tree, tree which bears flowers. — *Pushpadruma-kusumita-mukuta*, *as*, m. 'having a flowery diadem like a tree in blossom,' N. of a Gandharva-rāja. — *Pushpa-dha*, *as*, m. the offspring of an outcast Brāhman. — *Pushpa-dhanus*, *us*, or *pushpa-dhanvan*, *ā*, m. 'arming his bow with flowers,' an epithet of Kāma-deva the god of love. — *Pushpa-dhara*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, bearing flowers or blossoms, flowering. — *Pushpa-dhārana*, *as*, m. 'flower-bearer,' an epithet of Kṛiṣṇa. — *Pushpa-dhava*, *as*, m. 'characterized by flowers,' the god of love. — *Pushpa-nāṭaka*, a various reading for *pushpa-raṭhaka*, q. v. — *Pushpa-nikara*, *as*, m. scattering or throwing flowers; a multitude of flowers. — *Pushpa-niksha*,

*as*, m. 'flower-kissing,' a bee. — *Pushpa-niryāsa* or *pushpantryāsaka*, *as*, m. exudation or juice of flowers, nectar of flowers. — *Pushpa-netra*, *am*, n. the tube of a flower; a kind of cane or bamboo (?). — *Pushpan-dhaya*, *as*, m. 'flower-sucking,' a bee. — *Pushpa-patra*, *as*, m. 'feathered with flowers,' a kind of arrow. — *Pushpa-patrin*, *ī*, *inī*, *ī*, having flowers for arrows (an epithet of the bow of Kāma-deva). — *Pushpa-patka*, *as*, m. 'course of the menses,' the vulva. — *Pushpa-pāṇḍu*, *us*, m. a species of serpent. — *Pushpa-puta*, *as*, m. the sheath or calyx of a flower; the hands arranged in the shape of the calyx of a flower. — *Pushpa-pura*, *am*, n. the city Pāṭali-putra or Palibothra. — *Pushpa-pracāya*, *as*, m. plucking or gathering flowers; stealing flowers. — *Pushpa-pracāya*, *as*, m. plucking or gathering flowers. — *Pushpa-pracāyikā*, f. plucking or gathering flowers; *tava pushpapracāyikā*, it is thy turn to gather flowers, Schol. to Pāp. VI. 2, 74. — *Pushpa-prastāra*, *as*, m. a couch of flowers, flowery couch. — *Pushpaprastāra-sāyīn*, *ī*, *inī*, *ī*, reposing on a flowery couch. — *Pushpa-phala*, *am*, n. flowers and fruits; (*as*), m. the elephant or wood-apple tree, *Feronia Elephantum* (= *kapittha*); a pumpkin-gourd, *Benincasa Cerifera* (= *kushmāṇḍa*). — *Pushpaphala-druma*, *ās*, m. pl. trees bearing blossom and fruit. — *Pushpa-bali*, *is*, m. an offering or oblation of flowers. — *Pushpa-bhanga*, *as*, m. a festoon of flowers; (according to a Scholiast) treading on flowers. — *Pushpa-bha-draka*, *am*, n. 'beautiful with flowers,' N. of a particular wood. — *Pushpa-bhadra*, f., N. of a river. — *Pushpa-bhava*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, being or contained in flowers; (*as*), m. the nectar of flowers. — *Pushpa-bhūśhita*, *am*, n. 'adorned with flowers,' N. of a kind of Prakaraṇa, q. v. — *Pushpa-bherotsa*, *as*, m., N. of a man. — *Pushpa-manjarikā*, f. a blue lotus. — *Pushpa-maya*, *as*, *ī*, *am*, made or consisting of flowers, abounding in flowers, flowery. — *Pushpa-mālā*, f. a garland of flowers; N. of a work by Candra-śekhara. — *Pushpa-mās*, *ās*, or *pushpa-māsa*, *as*, m. 'flower-month,' the spring. — *Pushpa-mitra*, *as*, m., N. of a king, (according to the Brāhmanical account, a general of the last Maurya dynasty and father of prince Agni-mitra; or according to Buddhists, a king, the successor of Pushya-dharmān); N. of another king. — *Pushpa-rakta*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, red as a flower; dyed red with vegetable colour, as safflower &c.; (*as*), m. the shrub *Hibiscus Phoeniceus* (= *sūryamañi-vriksha*). — *Pushpa-rajās*, *as*, n. 'flower-dust,' pollen, especially saffron. — *Pushpa-ratha*, *as*, m. 'flower-chariot,' a car or carriage for travelling or for pleasure or any purpose except war. — *Pushpa-rasa*, *as*, m. 'flower-juice,' the nectar or honey of flowers. — *Pushpa-rasāhvaya* ('*sa-āh*'), *as*, m. 'having the name flower-juice,' honey, nectar. — *Pushpa-rāga* or *pushpa-rāja*, *as*, m. a topaz. — *Pushpa-reṇu*, *us*, m. 'flower-dust,' the dust or farina of flowers, pollen. — *Pushpa-rocana*, *as*, m. the plant *Mesua Roxburghii*. — *Pushpa-lāva*, *as*, m. a flower-gatherer, flower-seller, garland-maker; (*ī*), f. a female flower-gatherer. — *Pushpa-lāvīn*, *ī*, m. a flower-gatherer, garland-maker. — *Pushpa-līksha*, *as*, m. 'flower-licker,' a bee. — *Pushpa-lipi*, *is*, f. 'flower-writing,' N. of a particular style of writing. — *Pushpa-līh*, *t*, m. 'flower-licker,' a large black bee. — *Pushpa-raṭhaka*, *as*, m. a courtier, gallant; (also read *pushpa-nāṭaka*). — 1. *pushpa-val*, *ān*, *atī*, *at*, having flowers, flowery, blooming, decorated with flowers; (*ān*), n., N. of a Daitya; of a man; of a prince; of a mountain in Kuśā-dvīpa; (*anta*), m. du. the sun and moon [cf. *pushpa-danta*]; (*atī*), f. a menstruous woman; N. of a sacred bathing-place. — 2. *pushpa-val*, *ind*, like a flower. — *Pushpa-vana*, *am*, n. 'flower-forest,' N. of a forest. — *Pushpa-varsha*, *as*, m., N. of a mountain; (*am*), n. or *pushpa-varshaṇa*, *am*, n. 'flower-rain,' a shower of flowers, flowers showered from heaven upon a hero or demigod or on any great occasion. — *Pushpa-varshīn*, *ī*, *inī*, *ī*, raining or showering

flowers. — *Pushpa-vāfi* or *pushpa-vāfiṭhā*, f. a flower garden. — *Pushpa-vāhana*, *as*, m. 'having a flowery car,' N. of a king of Pushkara. — *Pushpa-vāhīnī*, f. 'carrying flowers,' N. of a river. — *Pushpa-vriksha*, *as*, m. a tree bearing blossoms. — *Pushpa-vrīṣṭi*, *is*, f. 'flower-rain,' a shower of flowers. — *Pushpa-veṇi*, f. a chaplet or garland of flowers; N. of a river. — *Pushpa-śakati*, f. a heavenly voice, voice from heaven; raining flowers (?). — *Pushpa-sakalin*, *ī*, m. 'having flower-like scales,' a kind of serpent. — *Pushpa-śāyā*, f. a couch of flowers, flowery couch. — *Pushpa-śara*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for arrows,' Kāma-deva the god of love. — *Pushpa-śarāsana*, *as*, m. 'arming his bow with flowers,' the god of love. — *Pushpa-śūnya*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, destitute of blossoms, not bearing flowers, flowerless; (*as*), m. the tree *Ficus Glomerata*. — *Pushpa-śrī*, *is*, f. abundance or beauty of flowers. — *Pushpaśrī-garbha*, *as*, m. 'filled with the beauty of flowers,' N. of a Bodhi-sattva. — *Pushpa-samaya*, *as*, m. 'flower-season,' the spring. — *Pushpa-sādhārana*, *as*, m. the common time for flowers, spring. — *Pushpa-sāyaka*, *as*, m. 'having flowers for arrows,' the god of love. — *Pushpa-sāra*, *as*, m. the nectar or honey of flowers; (*ā*), f. basil (= *tulasi*). — *Pushpa-sūtra*, *am*, n., N. of a Sūtra work ascribed to Gobhila. — *Pushpa-saurabhā*, f. the plant *Methonica Superba* (= *kalī-kārī*). — *Pushpa-snāna*, *am*, n. 'bathing with flowers,' a kind of inauguration. — *Pushpa-sveda*, *as*, m. the nectar or honey of flowers. — *Pushpa-hārīn*, *ī*, *inī*, *ī*, stealing or taking away flowers. — *Pushpa-hāsa*, *as*, m. 'smiling with flowers,' a flower garden (?); an epithet of Viṣṇu; N. of a man; (*ā*), f. a woman during menstruation. — *Pushpa-hīna*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, destitute of flowers or blossoms, flowerless, not flowering; (*ā*), f. the glomerous fig-tree, *Ficus Glomerata*; a woman past child-bearing, barren woman. — *Pushpākara* ('*pa-āk*'), *as*, *ā*, *am*, rich or abounding in flowers, flowery; *pushpākaro māsaḥ*, the flowery month, spring. — *Pushpākara-deva*, *as*, m., N. of a poet. — *Pushpāgama* ('*pa-āg*'), *as*, m. 'flower-advent,' the spring. — *Pushpājiva* ('*pa-āj*'), *as*, or *pushpājivīn* ('*pa-āj*'), *ī*, m. 'living by flowers,' a gardener, florist, garland-maker. — *Pushpānjana* ('*pa-an*'), *am*, n. calx of brass employed as a collyrium. — *Pushpānjali* ('*pa-an*'), *is*, *is*, *ī*, presenting flowers or a nosegay in both hands opened and hollowed (= *prasūnānjali*). — *Pushpānana* ('*pa-ān*'), *as*, m. 'flower-faced,' N. of a Yaksha. — *Pushpānpīḍa* ('*pa-āp*'), *as*, m. a chaplet of flowers; N. of a Gandharva. — *Pushpābhikīrṇa* ('*pa-abh*'), *as*, *ā*, *am*, strewed with flowers; (*as*), m. a kind of serpent ('having spots like flowers'). — *Pushpābhīshaka* ('*pa-abh*'), *as*, m. = *pushpa-snāna*, q. v. — *Pushpāmbuja* ('*pa-am*'), *as*, m. the sap of flowers. — *Pushpāmbhas* ('*pa-am*'), *as*, n., N. of a sacred bathing-place. — *Pushpāyudha* ('*pa-āy*'), *as*, m. 'flower-armed,' the god of love. — *Pushpārṇa* ('*pa-ar*'), *as*, m., N. of a son of Vatsara and Svar-vīthi. — *Pushpārācāya* ('*pa-ar*'), *as*, m. gathering flowers. — *Pushpārācāyīn* ('*pa-ar*'), *ī*, *inī*, *ī*, gathering flowers, a flower-gatherer. — *Pushpāvatī*, f., N. of a town. — *Pushpāvati-vanarāji-kusumitābhījīna* ('*pa-āv*'), *ta-abh*'), *as*, m. 'knowing the season of the flowering of the rows of flowers and of the paths of the forest,' N. of a Buddha. — *Pushpāsara* ('*pa-as*'), *as*, m. a decoction of flowers; (*am*), n. honey. — *Pushpāsāra* ('*pa-ās*'), *as*, m. 'flower-rain,' a shower of flowers. — *Pushpāstra* ('*pa-as*'), *as*, m. 'having flowers for missiles,' Kandarpa or Kāma-deva the god of love. — *Pushpāhara* ('*pa-āh*'), *as*, *ā*, *am*, taking or plucking flowers. — *Pushpāhvā* ('*pa-āh*'), f. the plant *Anethum Sowa* (= *sata-pushpā*). — *Pushpeshu* ('*pa-īshu*'), *us*, m. 'flower-arrows,' the god of love. — *Pushpotkaṭā* ('*pa-ut*'), f., N. of a Rākshasi, the mother of Rāvāṇa and Kumbha-kaṇja. — *Pushpodakā* ('*pa-ud*'), f. 'having flowers for water,' N. of a river in the lower world. — *Pushpodgama* ('*pa-ud*'), *as*, m. the coming forth or
