—*Śvāsa-tā*, f. breathing, respiration, aspiration.
—*Śvāsa-prasvāsa-dhāraṇa*, *am*, n. suppression or suspension of inspiration and expiration (= *prānā-yāma*, q.v.). —*Śvāsa-rodha*, *as*, m. an obstruction of the breath. —*Śvāsa-hikkā*, f. a kind of hiccup.
—*Śvāsa-heti*, *is*, f. 'cure for hard breathing,' sleepiness, sleep. —*Śvāsāri* ('sa-ari), *is*, m. 'breath-enemy,' a kind of plant (= *pushkara-mūla*). —*Śvāsodhvāsa* ('sa-uś'), *au*, m. du. inspiration and exhalation, respiration.

Śvāsita, *as*, *ā*, *am*, caused to breathe, refreshed, invigorated.

Śvāsin, *i*, *ini*, *i*, breathing, respiring; (*i*), m. air, wind.

श्वस 2. *śvas*, ind. (according to some connected with the lost rt. *śvi* in *śvit*, 'to be white,' and originally denoting 'the morrow's dawn'); tomorrow; future, (at the beginning of a comp.); future happiness or fortune, (apparently used in this sense at the beginning of certain comps.); a particle implying auspiciousness; [cf. Lat. *cras*.] —*Śvah-sreyasa*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, 'happy in the future,' happy, prosperous; (*am*), n. happiness, prosperity; Brahma, the Supreme Spirit; (*am*), ind. happy, well, right.

—*Śvah-suytā*, *f*, Ved. to-morrow's preparation of the Soma. —*Svo-bhūta*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, being to-morrow; (*e*), ind. on its being to-morrow. —*Svo-vasiya*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, 'happy for all future time,' auspicious, fortunate; (*am*), n. happiness. —*Svo-vasiyas*, *ān*, *asi*, *as*, fortunate, prosperous, auspicious. —*Svo-vasiyasa*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, fortunate, auspicious; (*am*), n. auspiciousness, good fortune. —*Svo-rasyasa*, *am*, *n*, Ved., N. of Brahma.

Śvastana, *as*, *ī*, *am*, belonging to the morrow, what will be to-morrow, future; (*am*), n. the future [cf. Lat. *crastinus*]; (*i*), f. scil. *vibhakti*, a grammatical term for the personal terminations of the first future.

Śvastyā, *as*, *ā*, *am*, belonging to the morrow, what will be to-morrow, future.

श्वागणिक *śvāganika*. See p. 1030, col. 2.

श्वात 1. *śvātra*, *as*, *ā*, *am* (probably fr. rt. *śvi*; cf. *savas*, *śvā*), Ved. increasing, powerful, strong, flourishing, blooming (according to some); quick, swift, (Sāy. = *kshipra-dharmaṇa*, Rig-veda X. 46, 7); (*am*), ind. quickly, (Sāy. = *kshipram*); (*am*), n. prosperity, riches, wealth. —*Śvātra-bhājā*, *k*, *k*, Ved. wealth-associated, endowed with riches.

2. *śvātra*, Nom. P. *śvātrati*, &c., Ved. to go, hasten, (enumerated among the *gati-karmāṇah* in Naigh. II. 14.)

Śvātya, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. cusing prosperity or happiness, (Sāy. = *sukhāraha*); going quickly, (Sāy. = *kshipra-gamanārha*.)

श्वान *śvāna*, &c. See p. 1030, col. 2.

श्वान *śvānta*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. wearied; placid, (Sāy. = *śrānta* or *sānta*, Rig-veda I. 145, 4.)

श्वापद *śvā-pada*, *śvā-vidh*, &c. See under *śvan*.

श्वासुरि *śvāsuri*, *is*, *m*. (fr. *śvaśura*), a patronymic.

श्वि *śvi* (this rt. assumes the form *śu*, q.v., in some of its tenses and derivatives; cf. rt. *śav*), cl. I. P. *śvayati*, *śvāva* or *śivāya* (2nd sing. *śusvayitha* or *śivayitha*, 3rd du. *śusvatus* or *śivayatus*), *śvayishyati*, *śvayit* or *śvat* or *śivayit*, Prec. *śvāyat*, *śvayitum*, to swell, increase, grow; to thrive; to appear (Ved., see *vi-śvi*, referred by some to rt. *śvit*); to go, approach: Pass. *śvayate*, Aor. *śvāyāti*: Caus. *śvāyati*, *-yitum*, Aor. *śvāsavat* or *śivayat*, (according to others also *śivayat*): Desid. of Caus. *śusvayishati* or *śivayayishati*, to cause to swell or

grow or be prosperous: Desid. *śivayishati*: Intens. *śesvigate*, *śosvigate*, *śesvayiti*, *śesvati*, to swell much; [cf. Gr. κυ-έω, κύ-ος, κύ-η-μα, κύ-αρ, κύ-τ-ος, κοί-λο-ς, κοιλ-ία, κανλό-ς, κύ-λο-γ, έγ-κισθώ, κίσσα, κίλαμος, κώλος, κήκις, κίκυς, (probably also) κίνα, κίω, κινέω, perhaps also κέ-μη (for κύ-μη): Lat. *in-cl-ens*, *cu-mu-lu-s*, *cavu-s*, *cau-li-s*, *cau-læ*, *cælu-m*, *ciliu-m*, *super-cili-um*, *cuneus*, *crescere*; *com-a*: Goth. *us-hul-on*, *hul-und*: Old Germ. *hol*, (according to some) *wi-t*, 'wide' (= *śvita*): Engl. *Sax. hol*: Hib. *cī-neas*, *cineachdin*, 'growth, increase.']

Śuti, *is*, f. swelling, increasing.

Śūna, *as*, *ā*, *am*, swollen, &c. See s. v.

Śuyamana, *as*, *ā*, *am*, being swollen, swelling, enlarging, expanding.

Śesvīyamāna, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. swelling or increasing excessively, enlarging, expanding.

Śraya, *as*, m. swelling, increase.

Śvayātha, *us*, *m*, swelling, intumescence. —*Śvayā-thu-śikitsā*, *f*, the cure or treatment of swellings, &c.

Śvayana, *am*, n. swelling, intumescence.

Śvayītvā, *ind*, having swelled or increased.

Śvayīci, *is*, f. sickness, disease.

श्वीकृष्ण *śvīkra*, *ās*, *m*, pl., N. of a race; [cf. *śvīkra*.]

श्वित *śvit* (perhaps a kind of Nom.

based on a lost rt. *śvi*, cf. Zend *spitama*, &c.), cl. I. A. *śvetate* (Ved. also P. *-ti*), *śivite*, *śvītihye*, *śvetiṣṭha*, *śvītāt*, *śvītūm*, to be or become white, (according to Vopā-deva XXI. 15. *śvetayati* = *śvetāśvam* *āśāshle*); [cf. Lith. *swēčiu* for *swetiu*, 'I shine'; Inf. *swēti* for *swēti*, (perhaps also) *śvēta*, 'the world'; *kaičiu* for *kaitiu*, *kaitinu*, 'I make hot'; *kais-tu* for *kait-tu*, 'I become warm'; *kaitau*: Slav. *svit-a-ti*, 'to become light'; *svjet*, 'light, the world.]

Śvīta, *as*, *ā*, *am*, white; (*am*), n. whiteness (according to Sāy.).

Śvītā, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. being white, white-coloured, (Sāy. = *śvēlamāna*, *śvēta-varṇa*, Rig-veda VI. 6, 2.)

Śvīti, whiteness, a white colour (according to Sāy.). —*Śvīti-āśi*, *an*, *-tiśi*, *ak*, Ved. going to whiteness, becoming white, white-coloured, fair-complexioned, white, (Sāy. on Rig-veda VII. 83, 8. *śvītāñdah* = *śvītā* *śvītāyam* *nātmaṇyam* *āñcāto* *gāñchāntah*)

Śvītā, *as*, *ā*, *am*, see Pāṇ. VII. 2, 16, 17.

Śvīta, white (according to Sāy. on Rig-veda I. 100, 18).

Śvītāya, *as*, *ā*, *am*, Ved. white, white-coloured, fair-complexioned (said of the winds or Maruts according to Sāy. on Rig-veda I. 100, 18; but according to some more probably referring to the fair-coloured worshippers of Indra as opposed to the darker aborigines of India).

Śvītya, *as*, *ā*, *am*, white, white-coloured.

Śvītā, *as*, *m*, morbid whiteness of the skin, white leprosy, vitiligo; = *antarikṣa* (Ved., cf. *śvītreyā*); (*ā*), f. a proper N. —*Śvīta-ghnī*, *f*, 'removing whiteness of the skin,' the plant *Tragia involucrata* (= *pīṭa-parṇī*).

Śvītīn, *i*, *īñ*, *i*, affected with whiteness of the skin or leprosy, leprous; (*i*), m. a leper.

Śvītā, *as*, *m*, Ved. a son of *Śvītā*.

Śvīta, *as*, *ā* or *śvēti*, *am*, white, dressed in white; (*as*), m. white (the colour); the planet Venus or its regent Sukra; the sixth range of mountains dividing the known continent, the white mountains separating the Varshas of Hiranyaksha and Rāmyaka; one of the minor Dvīpas or divisions of the world, (see *śvīta-dvīpa*); a white cloud; cumin seed; a conch-shell; N. of a particular Avatāra of Siva; of a manifestation of Vishnu in his Varaha incarnation (worshipped in a particular part of India); N. of one of Siva's pupils; (*as*, *ā*), m. f. a small white shell, cowrie; (*ā*), f. one of the tongues of Fire; a kind of grass, *Andropogon Aciculatum*; a kind of plant (=

kāshṭha-pāṭalā); *Aconitum Ferox*; various other plants (= *aparajitā*; = *śvēta-vṛihati*; = *śvēta-kantakārī*; = *pāshāṇa-bhedin*; = *śīlā-valkalā*; = *chūrīkā-pattrī*); hogweed; white Dürvā grass; bamboo-manna; crystal; clayed or candied sugar; a mystical term for the letter *s*; (*am*), n. silver; (*śvēta vaidārvā* or *vaidārya* or *vaidaryo* is according to some 'a serpent demon,' others give *śvēta-vaidārava* as signifying 'a particular deity connected with the sun'); [cf. Goth. *hveit-s*, 'white'; (perhaps) *hveitē*, 'wheat'; Old Germ. *hwiz*, *wiz*: Old Sax. *Angl. Sax.*, Old Norse *hwit*: Lith. *kwētys*, 'wheat.')

—*Śvēta-kantakārī*, *f*, a species of plant (= *priyan-kari*). —*Śvēta-kandā*, *f*, 'having a white bulb,' the plant *Aconitum Ferox*. —*Śvēta-kamala*, *am*, n. a white lotus. —*Śvēta-kākīya*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, belonging or relating to a white crow.

—*Śvēta-kinīhi*, *f*, a species of Kipphi with white blossoms. —*Śvēta-kuijara*, *as*, *m*, 'white elephant,' Indra's elephant *Āvātā*. —*Śvēta-kusa*, *as*, *m*, white Kuśa grass (= *punya-trīpa*). —*Śvēta-kushtha*, *am*, *n*, white leprosy. —*Śvēta-ketu*, *us*, *m*, a Buddha or Jaina saint; epithet of the descending node; N. of a Brahman; of a sage (son of Uddālaka). —*Śvēta-keśa*, *as*, *m*, white hair; a variety of the Hyperanthus *Moringa*. —*Śvēta-kola*, *as*, *m*, 'having a white or glittering breast,' the *Saphara fish*. —*Śvēta-khadira*, *as*, *m*, a white variety of the Khadira tree. —*Śvēta-gaṅgā*, *f*, 'the white Ganges,' N. of a river. —*Śvēta-gaja*, *as*, *m*, a white elephant; the elephant of Indra. —*Śvēta-garut*, *t*, or *śvēta-ga-ruta*, *as*, *m*, 'white-winged,' a goose. —*Śvēta-quñja*, *f*, a kind of plant (= *bhirintilā*). —*Śvēta-ghoshā*, *f*, a white Ghoshā plant. —*Śvēta-śandana*, *am*, *n*, white sandal. —*Śvēta-śillikā* or *śvēta-śilli*, *f*, a kind of pot-herb. —*Śvēta-śāhatrī*, *am*, *n*, a white umbrella; (*as*, *ā*, *am*), having a white umbrella. —*Śvēta-śāhada*, *as*, *m*, 'white-winged' or 'white-leaved,' a goose; a kind of basil, *Ocymum Album*. —*Śvēta-jiraka*, *as*, *m*, white cumin. —*Śvēta-śāṅkha* or *śāṅkana*, *am*, *n*, white or refined borax. —*Śvēta-tā*, *f*, whiteness. —*Śvēta-dūrvā*, *f*, white Dürvā grass. —*Śvēta-dvīpa*, *as*, *m*, a white elephant; Indra's elephant. —*Śvēta-dvīpa*, *as*, *m*, 'the white island,' N. of one of the eighteen minor Dvīpas or divisions of the known continent, (also termed *Candra-dvīpa*, see *candra*; identified by some with *Vaikuntha*, q.v., and by others supposed to be Britain); N. of a place near Kāśi. —*Śvēta-dhātū*, *us*, *m*, a white mineral; chalk; the milk-stone, opal or chalcedony. —*Śvēta-dhāman*, *ā*, *m*, 'having white lustre,' the moon; camphor; cuttlefish bone. —*Śvēta-nīla*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, white and black, (*as*), *m*, a cloud. —*Śvēta-pattra*, *am*, *n*, a white feather; (*as*), *m*, 'white-feathered,' a goose. —*Śvēta-pattra-ratha*, *as*, *m*, 'whose vehicle is a goose,' epithet of Brahmapūra. —*Śvēta-padmā*, *Śvēta-padmā*, *am*, *n*, the white lotus. —*Śvēta-parṇā*, *f*, a kind of plant (= *vāri-parṇī*). —*Śvēta-parṇāśa*, *as*, *m*, white basil. —*Śvēta-parvata*, *as*, *m*, 'white-mountain,' N. of a mountain. —*Śvēta-pāṭalā*, *f*, the white trumpet-flower, *Bignonia Suaveolens*. —*Śvēta-pinga*, *as*, *m*, 'white and tawny,' a lion. —*Śvēta-pingala*, *as*, *m*, 'white and tawny,' a lion; epithet of Siva. —*Śvēta-pingalaka*, *as*, *m*, a lion. —*Śvēta-pīṇḍitā*, *as*, *m*, a kind of plant (= *māhā-pīṇḍitarū*). —*Śvēta-pūṇarāvā*, *f*, the white-flowered hogweed. —*Śvēta-pushpa*, *am*, *n*, a white flower; (*as*), *m*, 'having white flowers,' the plant *Vitis Trifolia*, = *sindhu-vāra*; (*ā*), *f*, a Ghoshā with white flowers; another plant (= *nāga-danti*); colocynth. —*Śvēta-pushpa*, *as*, *ikā*, *am*, having white flowers; (*as*), *m*, the plant *Nerium Odorum* (the white variety); (*ikā*), *f*, a kind of plant (= *putra-dātri*); another plant (= *māhā-saṇapushpi*). —*Śvēta-prasūnaka*, *as*, *ā*, *am*, having white flowers; (*as*), *m*, the tree *Tapia Cratæva*. —*Śvēta-balā*, *f*, the white Balā, a kind of plant. —*Śvēta-bhāḍā*, *f*, the plant *Clitoria Ternatea*. —*Śvēta-bhikshu*, *us*, *m*, a kind of mendicant. —*Śvēta-māṇḍāraka*, *as*, *m*, a kind of tree (= *prīthvi-kuravaka*). —*Śvēta-mariča*,
