Rṣabha (VIII)—the son of Nābhi and Sudevī (Merudevī according to Vi., Vā. & Br. P.) An avatār of Viṣṇu, eldest of all Kṣatra. A Paramahamsa. Had a hundred sons of whom Bharata was the eldest. Nine of these became rulers of the nine dvīpas of the world. Eightyone
