Kārttikeya (Guha) (1)—a god with his vāhana as peacock; conqueror of Krauñca of Asuras; also Kumāra;¹ brought up by the Kṛttikas;² delight to the mind of Umā;³ overheard the report given by his father to Pārvati on the subject of the colour of his throat, the Nīlakantha legend, when he was lying down on the lap of Umā on the top of the Kai-
