*Dhantapāpā*—a R. rising on the Himālayas.

*Dhanyā* (I)—the Vaiśya caste of Krauñcadvīpa.

*Dhanyā* (II)—a daughter of Manas; wife of Dhruva; gave birth to a son Śiṣṭa.

M. 4. 38.

*Dhanva* (I)—a son of Dirghatapas.

Br. III. 67. 7.

*Dhanva* (II)—the place with water at all times, suitable for fortresses.

Vā. 8. 98.

*Dhanva* (III)—a country, the people of which met Kṛṣṇa with presents on his way to Mithilā.

Bhā. X. 86. 20.

*Dhanvakārā*—a Rudra on the ṣoḍaśa cakra.

Br. IV. 34. 26.

*Dhanvatīrūpā*—a R. rising on the Ṛṣyavat hill.

M. 114. 24.

*Dhanvantari* (I)—an *avatār* of Viṣṇu; a son of Dirghatama(p)as, the originator of the Āyurveda, and the father of Ketuman.<sup>1</sup> According to one account he appeared during the Amṛtamathana, when Hari called Dh. Abja (Aja-Vā. P.).
