Dhanva (1)—a son of Dirghatapas.

Dhanva (II)—the place with water at all times, suitable for fortresses.

Dhanva (III)—a country, the people of which met Kṛṣṇa with presents on his way to Mithilā.

Dhanvakārā—a Rudra on the sodaśa cakra.

Dhanvatīrūpā—a R. rising on the Rsyavat hill.
