

Dhr̥ṣṭa (III)—a son of Kunti and father of Nirvrti.

Dhr̥ṣṭa (V)—a son of Kunti.

Dhr̥ṣṭaketu (I)—a son of Sudhr̥ti and father of Haryaśva.

Dhr̥ṣṭaketu (II)—a son of Satyaketu and father of Sukumāra.

Dhr̥ṣṭaketu (III)—a son of Dhr̥ṣṭadyumna and the last Pāñcāla.

Dhr̥ṣṭaketu (IV)—a king of the Kaikayas and a vassal prince of Yudhiṣṭhira; married Śrutakīrti and had five sons Santardana and others;¹ joined the Pāñdavās against the Kurus;² went to Syamantapañcaka for the solar eclipse.³

Dhr̥ṣṭaketu (V)—a son of Sukumāra and father of Venuhotra; a righteous king.

Dhr̥ṣṭadyumna—a son of Drupada and father of Dhr̥ṣṭaketu, last of the Pañcālakas;¹ joined the Pāñdavās against the Kurus and was the commander of the Pāñdava hosts; killed Droṇa.²
