

*Nyāsa*(*mantra*)—in connection with the installation of an image; eg. *Ratnanyāsa* for the eight directions: diamond, pearl, vaidūrya, conch, spaṭika, puśparāga, indranila and nila; pastes of eight kinds: tālaka, śilāvajra, collyrium, śyāma, kañji, kāśi, māksikam, and gairikam; grains of eight kinds: wheat, barley, seasamum, mudga, nīvāra, śyāmaka, sarṣapa, and vrihirice, scents like sandal, red sandal, agarū, añjanam, uśiram, vaisṇavī sahadevī, and Laksmaṇa; metals of eight kinds: gold, vidruma, copper, bronze, ārakūtaka, silver, puśpam and iron. Then the worship of the Lokhapālas with *Nyāsamantras*.
