Ṣaṭketu—a commander of Bhaṇḍa.

Ṣaṭbrahmāṇa—Marīci, Kratu, Atri, Pulastya, Pulaha, and Vasumat or Vasiṣṭha; these are known as Prajāpatis as they are concerned with the increase of *santāna* to the world.
