Sañjaya (I)—also called Sūta; addressed as Gāvalgaṇa by Yudhiṣṭhira, was not able to tell him where Dhṛtarāṣṭra had gone; welcomed Vidura.

Sañjaya (II)—the son of Raṇamjaya, and father of Śākya.
