J. J. Meyer, transl. Kaut., p. 141, note 8 : Gan. explains that *kola* is the small, *badara* the large and *sauvīraka* the sweet jujube. Da. on Su.Sū. 46, 139 : *badara* is large, *kola* is of a moderate size and *karkandhu* is small; *sauvīra* is the largest (among the jujube-fruits) and is, both ripe and unripe, sweet.

hapuṣā

- (I) a) black stalks like those of black pepper, possessed of an aromatic smell (Dutt; HK; Kav);
 b) name of a partic. substance, said to be of a long form and black colour, and smelling like raw meat or fish; it is of two kinds (MW);
 c) a partic. plant of two kinds, smelling like fish; the fruits of one kind resemble those of the *aśvattha* (PW);
 d) *hapuṣā* : an article of trade that is of a black colour and of a long form like the stalks of black pepper (*marīca*) (Vss);
havuṣā : a fruit of that name; it is of two kinds; one is like a
